INTRODUCTION

The Recreation and Parks (R&P) Board is a nine (9) member board appointed by the Commissioners of St. Mary's County (CSMC) "to provide advice and assistance concerning a comprehensive program of public recreation, including establishment, operation, and maintenance of a system of public parks and facilities throughout St. Mary's County." The Board generally meets on the first Thursday of each month, at 5:30 P.M., in the Chesapeake Building, in Leonardtown.

During calendar year 2019, the Parks system consisted of twenty-one (21) parks and fifteen (15) public waterfront landings. The Department manages the Leonard Hall, Margaret Brent, Hollywood and Carver Recreation Centers; a Gymnastics Center; the Great Mills Swimming Pool; Skatepark and Sprayground at Nicolet Park; Three Notch Trail; and numerous Licensed Extended Day Centers (before and after school care centers).

Additionally, the Department manages the 150± acre Wicomico Shores Golf Course (WSGC), with oversight provided by the WSGC Advisory Board. The Department also manages the St. Clement's Island Museum, the Piney Point Lighthouse Museum and the Drayden African American Schoolhouse; oversight of these facilities is provided by the Museum Board of Trustees.

The Department is comprised of five divisions: Administration; Recreation; Parks; Museums; and Golf Course. The Director of Recreation and Parks provides supervision and management for these divisions, in addition managing capital planning for new parks and facility expansion and enhancements.

SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2019

- ➤ The Commissioners of St. Mary's County passed a Tobacco Free Park resolution.
- The Department began the process for national accreditation through the Commission for Accreditation for Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA).
- The Commissioners of St. Mary's County approved the Lexington Manor Passive Park Master Plan.
- A contract was awarded for the installation of three (3) synthetic turf fields -Chancellors Run Regional Park, Chaptico Park and Dorsey Park
- Program Open Space funds in the amount of \$1,440,00 was approved for the following projects:
 - Chaptico Park Irrigation for three (3) renovated grass game fields and lights on an additional field
 - Dorsey Park- Playground replacement project
 - Lexington Manor Passive Park- Renovation of park streets, additional lighting and public restroom
- Renovated the football game fields at 5th District Park and Lancaster Park, including irrigation
- Upgraded the 90' baseball field at Chancellors Run Regional Park
- Installed playgrounds at Hollywood Recreation Center and St. Andrew's Estates
- A contract was awarded for the master planning and design work at Shannon Farms
