Approval of 3/2/2018 Minutes: Moved for approval by Lynn Fitrell, seconded by Jeanette Pettit, passed unanimously.

Old Business

- AAM Re-Accreditation Report: No news on AAM Re-accreditation report because the meeting to accredit is not until June. Accreditation is expected then.
- DNR/St. Clements Island MOU: Next meeting on this issue is on May 17th. Lynn Fitrell and Peter Neus will represent our board; Dale Springer and Johnny Wood will represent the Museum Friends. They will report back on decisions and progress.
- 2017 Annual Report Distribution: It was mailed to board members and printed for distribution.
 Dale Springer noted this report is a good change from the past in format, information, and use
 of photos; it should be well received by stakeholders. Initially, it was submitted as the Museum
 Board of Trustees' annual report to the County Commissioners. We have, however, now
 prepared a separate document as an Annual Report, with reports of our activities, member
 attendance, etc. It may be found online at the County's website.

New Business

- Open Division Position Marketing: the Museum staff has an open position for a Marketing specialist. Rachel has been accepted into U of Maryland's PhD program and so has resigned. The position has been posted and will close on May 23rd. There are already have promising applications.
- Monthly Reports & Upcoming Events Karen Stone
 - The Museums and staff have been very busy. Maryland Day in March was per aps the most significant of many events. It was three separate events: One in Historic St Mary's City, one at the Drayden School, and one St Clements Island Museum.
 - The Drayden School is now open. Students from King's Christina Academy (9th and 10th grades) are visiting for classes, and the UCAC is conducting those classes. The students will be given the name of someone who attended the school; they will research that person's life and times, including the daily life in the school house. The students are getting diplomas, based on an actual diploma from a Drayden School graduate. Jeanette Pettit will teach a class next Friday. The students will discover many of the joys of attending the Drayden

School but also unfortunate examples of racism from the past. It will be interesting to see how they adjust from the modern world to a less modern school experience—how to get water, no restroom facilities, etc. Don Cropp is to be given a preservation award for his work at Drayden by the County Commissioners.

- Other significant programs include the Black Diamond Memorial Event; participation in the Cherry Blossom Festival; Potomac River cleanup events.
- Many of these events were "weather challenged" but nonetheless all were well-attended and successful.
- The Division has hired an additional "on call" captain for the boat; seasonal workers are now in place. The museums ae ready for a busy summer.
- Ms. Stone will be participating in a newly created team, the St. Mary's
 Museum Group. Members will also include Sotterley, St. Mary's Historical
 Society, Historic St Mary's City, Naval Air Museum, and Point Lookout. They
 will work with new Tourism Team to see how we can better promote our joint
 aims in the county.

- Department Update -Arthur Shepherd:
 - Arthur expressed appreciation for our support of the Museums.
 - The County's FY19 budget will be signed, with an IT position and a captain for the Museum Division.
 - Fox 5 News will have a "Zip Trip" on June 15th, held at the Interpretive Center; we want a live, strong crowd, and Trustees are encouraged to promote the event. The UCAC will be involved. Capital improvements are in the FY19 budget for the Interpretive Center—better lighting, sidewalks, some cleanup, to make it even more of a community meeting area.
- Friend's Update- Dale Springer: Louis Aldridge recently stepped down as President; Dale Springer has become President. The Friends need to replace Dale's position until next annual elections. This event has left an open board position to fill. Amber Puschinsky was hired January 1 as fundraising coordinator and bookkeeper. She has prepared a package/brochure of all the Friends' activities to encourage members of the public to be involved. The Museum Stores are up and running; stock has been updated. Local consignments are getting lots of attention in the shops.
- 300 tickets to Jazz Festival are already sold; it will likely sell-out but the Friends are preparing advertising to make sure. For a time, it seemed likely that we couldn't use the vacant lots for parking because it is for sale, but this issue has been settled for now.

Some additional reports:

- April Havens reported on some changes to exhibits at Piney Point.
 - A timeline is being put in place, highlighting local history, including the lives of lighthouse keepers or coast guardsman from 1790 to 1980. It is a timeline of significant events for the entire Piney Point/ St George's area.
 - An exhibit on the hotel will be started; getting artifacts from it has been a challenge but some are coming together.
 - The museum will now include an osprey area, with information about their lives and habitat, eggs, wing spans, etc.
 - These displays will include many interactive elements
- Ms. Stone reported St Clements Island renovation is moving into the next phase; staff are making plans to take everything out, including some document housecleaning
