b) OFFICE OF PLANNING PLANS REVIEWER POSITION

The County Administrator presented a memorandum dated January 11, 1985 from the Personnel Officer recommending the appointment of Charles P. Brenton to the position of Plans Reviewer, Grade 15, in the Office of Planning and Zoning. The principle responsibility of this one-year contract position is Sedimentation Control and Storm Water Management and is funded through a state grant.

After discussion, Commissioner Sayre moved, seconded by Commissioner Aud, to approve hiring Mr. Brenton, with entry on duty to be determined at a later date. Motion carried.

BUDGET AMENDMENT NO. 85-45 COUNTY ENGINEER

4) FLOOD HAZARD MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The County Administrator advised that the County has an opportunity to participate in a Flood Hazard Management Program for McIntosh Run and presented correspondence for the Commissioners' signatures and approval to Water Resources Administration desginating the County Engineer as the contact person.

The Commissioners agreed to sign and foward said letter.

BUDGET ADJUSTMENT

The County Administrator presented correspondence dated January 17, 1985 from the Department of Agriculture enclosing an amendment to the Mosquito Control Agreement for a budgetary adjustment.

OFFICE OF COUNTY ENGINEER ITEMS

1) BID TALLY SHEET RENTAL CONTRACT SERVICES

The County Engineer presented the bid tally sheets for the following rental contract services with recommendations as indicated:

2) CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 BUSHWOOD WHARF PROJECT

The County Engineer presented the referenced Change Order in the amount of \$1,718 payable to Edwin A. and John O. Crandell, Inc. for the purpose of increasing the quantity of replacement items for pier repair. The project is totally funded by DNR.

Commissioner Dean moved, seconded by Commissioner Sayre, to approve and authorize Commissioner President Aud to sign said Change Order. Motion carried.

3) COUNTRY LAKES SUBDIVISION

The County Engineer advised that Country Lakes Subdivision is one of two subdivisions left that has a personal bond. He stated that there is minor work (surface treatment of shoulders and growth in ditches) to be done on the two remaining roads to be taken into the County's system.

Mr. Norris presented a Deed dated January 9,1985 by and between Country Lakes, a Maryland partnership, by Benjamin H. Burroughs, Jr., General Partner, and the Board of County Commissioners of St. Mary's County accepting the following roads into the County Highway Maintenance System: Tintop School Road, Yowaiski Mill Road (Section I), Redgate Drive, Tanyard Drive, Oxley Drive, Yowaiski Mill Road (Section II).

Commissioner Arnold moved, seconded by Commissioner Aud, to approve and sign said Deed. Motion carried.

Commissioner Aud moved, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, toapprove and sign Road Resolution Nos. R85-2 and R85-3. Motion carried.

4) STREET LIGHT CHANGE ORDER NO. 5

The County Engineer presented the referenced Change Order with Southern Maryland Electric for lighting at the intersection of Jones Wharf Road and Md. St.Rt. 235. Total net change in annual charge is \$183.60.

The Commissioners concurred in authorizing Commissioner Aud to sign Street Light Change Order.

5) STREET LIGHT CHANGE ORDER NO. 6

The County Engineer presented the referenced Change Order with Southern Maryland Electric for lighting at the entrance to Queen Anne Apartments on Rt. 246. Total net change in annual charge is \$201.

The Commissioners concurred in authorizing Commissioner Aud to sign said Street Light Change Order.

6) STANDARD "T" TURNAROUND

Mr. Norris presented the Road Ordinance Standard Plate for "T" Turnarounds which the Commissioners had previously approved and requested Commissioner President Aud's signature on same.

The Commissioners concurred in Commissioner Aud signing the "T" Turnaround Plate.

7) TALL TIMBERS SECOND SHORE EROSION CONTROL DISTRICT CORRESPONDENCE TO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

The County Engineer presented correspondence for the Commissioners' signatures to DNR stating that the County does not concur with DNR's project development schedule for the referenced project and, therefore, proposes to advance funds to consultant design costs so that construction can begin during this calendar year. This offer is made contingent upon reimbursement by DNR when the budgeted funds become available.

The Commissioners agreed to sign and forward said letter.

8) SNOW REMOVAL

Mr. Norris updated the Commissioners on the progress and success of the snow removal system to date stating that \$50,000 has been expended and there are enough funds for one more snow removal job.

9) REQUEST FOR EQUIPMENT

Mr. Norris requested authorization to use funds in his equipment budget for the purchase of a refrigerator, hot water pot and microwave oven for his department.

Commissioner Arnold moved, seconded by Commissioner Sayre, to approve this request. Motion carried.

Mr. Jarboe reviewed the report with the Commissioners and highlighted the recommendations (page 42-44) some of which require action by the Board of County Commissioners.

In conclusion, the Commissioners stated that they would take the recommendations under advisement and will respond in approximately 30 days.

As had previously been requested by the Board, Mr. Gerred presented a report addressing concerns relative to the issue of "floating homes." "Floating homes" have been introduced in the County at the Cedar Cove Marina, which have raised a number of environmental, tax and other questions. Mr. Gerred pointed out that in the report are alternatives by

which the Commissioners can address the issue including the possibility of legislation regulating "floating homes. He stated that the Health Department has adopted regulations declaring that they must be treated as single family residents and must have on-land disposal of wastewater and conveyance in an approved manner.

Commissioners Sayre and Arnold spoke out in opposition to "floating homes" because of pollution and aesthetic concerns.

Mr. Kimball stated that he has not received any negative comments about the project and further that he would not do anything to intentionally harm the environment. He advised that was willing to cooperate with the County and Legislators in any way.

Mr. Witten presented correspondence dated January 17, 1985 setting forth the Potomac River Association's opposition and requested that the Commissioners take action to amend the zoning ordinance to prohibit floating homes as a permitted use in all zoning categories.

Mr. Springer and Mr. Caruth each spoke in oppostion to "floating homes" being allowed in St. Mary's County.

Mrs. Whetstine, on behalf of the Taxpayers' Association, reiterated the Association's concerns relative to equitable taxing of such structures should they be allowed.

In conclusion, the Commissioners advised that they would address the issue of "floating homes" in a timely manner.

The referenced representatives of the Chamber of Commerce appeared before the Commissioners to request support in contacting our Congressional delegation regarding the impact of a navy moratorium on contract services and the resulting loss of jobs in St. Mary's County.

Dr. Jarboe pointed out that evidently insufficient funds were budgeted in the Contract Support Services for the Department of Defense and that 500-1,000 jobs in St. Mary's County are potentially involved.

Dr. Jarboe stated that contact has been made with Congressman Dyson to have the Secretary of Navy remove the restrictions on contract approvals.

Commissioner Dean stated that he had also learned of this situation and prepared correspondence for the Commissioners' review and signatures addressed to our Congressional Delegation directing their attention to this matter.

After discussion, the Commissioners agreed to sign and forward said letters.

COUNTY PROMOTION

Commissioner President Aud requested the assistance of the Chamber of Commerce to promote more positively St. Mary's County and to use the Chamber's influence in motivating the media to do the same. Commissioner Aud indicated that we are very fortunate in St. Mary's County and should be stressing the positive nature of the County rather than detracting in a negative way.

NO. 33 - ACCOMMODATION TAX
