#### a. AIRPORT LEASE AGREEMENT

Airport Lease Agreement with Piedmont Flight Center, Inc. for occupation of county-owned spaces in the General Aviation Hangar to begin September 15, 1999. (Deferred from September 7 pending County Attorney review.)

County Attorney Lacer advised that tenant (Piedmont) did not wish to sign the personal guarantee; however, it was Mr. Lacer's recommendation that the County require the guarantee as a good business practice unless the Board wanted to waive the guarantee in order to get the tenant at the airport.

After discussion Commissioner Raley moved, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve the lease agreement with the stipulation that a personal guarantee be included. Motion carried.

Later in the meeting Mr. Haley appeared before the Board to address the issue of the personal guarantee stating that the tenant would not sign it, but would be willing to provide the entire year's lease up front in addition to providing the \$625 security deposit.

Later in the meeting Commissioner Guazzo moved, seconded by Commissioner Mattingly, to cancel the requirement for the tenant to sign the personal guarantee and that instead, the tenant would pay up front the entire one year's lease plus the security deposit in advance of his occupying the premises. Motion carried.

In conclusion Commissioner Anderson suggested that the County should still investigate including a requirement for a signed personal guarantee for any lease the County Attorney believes would be necessary.

b. AIRPORT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (ACIP) FY2000-2004

FAA ACIP outline of airport improvement projects recommended for funding (Ratio is 95% federal, 5% state, 5% county). In order to receive the formal offer of those grant funds, the Commissioners must sign off on certain certifications.

5. ST. MARY'S COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY HOUSING BOND PROGRAM – OBO ALLOCATION TRANSFER

The MD DHCD utilizes local government housing bond allocations to issue bonds to fund housing programs "on behalf of" of local governments. In order to participate, local jurisdictions must transfer its allocation in writing. St. Mary's has assigned it allocation of \$1,509,637 to the Maryland Mortgage Program.

During discussion the Commissioners directed Mr. Nicholson to return to the Board to provide a more in depth briefing of this program, a review of other housing programs, and a report on other counties process in getting mortgage companies in the programs and how successful the programs are.

After discussion Commissioner Guazzo moved, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve and sign the allocation transfer correspondence to MD DHCD. Motion carried.

## 6. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS DOCUMENTS

- a. Addendum for Cedar Cove (Kedges Strait) Subdivision, located in the Eighth Election District, extending the completion date to September 1, 2000. The Letter of Credit provided by Nations Bank is being reduced from \$517,300 to \$380,000.

Ms. Wolf described the findings of the study including:

# Issues:

- That the service system is fragmented and complex
- That certain groups of consumers are unserved or underserved
- That there is no comprehensive communication mechanism among consumers and referring parties on availability and eligibility of services, access, etc.
- That there is as need for better coordination of services

#### Recommendations:

Mr. Carter indicated to the Board that there were steps that can be taken to address these issues:

- To establish a group of service providers to address the services needed and the targeted population.
- To take steps to collaborate and coordinate service providers to address the issues
- To organize case management services (getting medical needs addressed and also go through referral process under the direction of the senior information and assistance staff)
- ❖ In order to address informational needs a student from St. Mary's College will be working with the OOA to develop a data base of health service needs (as well as in cooperation with service providers).

# Hurricane/Tropical Storm Floyd

Commissioner Randall expressed appreciation to county staff for their efforts during the recent rainstorm and requested lists of those who assisted in order for the Commissioners to formally thank them. The Commissioners also thanked the volunteer fire departments, SMECo and Bell Atlantic, and emergency workers as well.

Commissioner Mattingly reported that SMECo was able to get its customers in the tricounty "up and running" by Saturday evening, the first in the State to have all its customers with electrical service after the storm.

Commissioner Anderson expressed appreciation to the Red Cross for all its efforts in helping citizens during this storm.

Commissioner Raley stated that St. Mary's County is very fortunate to have so many people that helped during the storm.

Commissioner Mattingly indicated that there were a number of roads that flooded during the storm, and that there is a Tri-County Council project in which the County is participating in called *Project Impact*. This program would be a good opportunity to get funding to address these problem areas.

As requested by the Commissioners the referenced individuals appeared before the Board to discuss transportation projects in preparation for the Department of Transportation presentation scheduled for Tuesday, September 28.

During discussion the Commissioners prioritized their transportation concerns they believed were critical:

- Route 237 (Chancellors Run Road) to accelerate the property acquisition and construction process
- Route 5 (Point Lookout Road)—to expedite improvements from the causeway to Camp Brown Road
- To investigate the construction of a center left turn lane in Leonardtown
- ❖ Route 235 To proceed with Phase III and to re-evaluate a northbound acceleration lane from the Base main gate at the Pegg Road intersection)
- Route 246 (Great Mills Road) to look into curb cut ramps and sidewalks around poles
- Flooding Conditions To do analysis of the following highways: Route 5 in Great Mills and Leonardtown, Flat Iron Road, Route 234; Route 243 (and to check out the process for the dam at St. Mary's Lake during storm conditions and to check out the dam for the Victoria's Grant project);
- ❖ Highly Erodible Soils to address runoff from state roads into tidal creeks

Other projects discussed included: St. Mary's County Airport (obstruction removal, runway extension, and an overlay to accommodate potential commuter air service providers); FDR Boulevard (to evaluate and determine if there are available alternative funding sources for this project); Route 4 (provisions for bypass lanes to be evaluated at high volume intersections on St. Andrews Church Road); Tulagi Place (sidewalk rehabilitation and enhancement); public transportation grants (support for increase in federal and state funds for the St. Mary's Transit System); Park and Ride facilities; Maintenance of Roadways; and State Review of the Unified Land Development Code.

Mr. Erichsen will prepare a letter to Department of Transportation Secretary Porcari for the Commissioners' review and signature.

In preparation for next week's bond ratings meetings in New York, Mr. Welkos appeared before the Board to review the general obligation bond financing process, the proposed 1999 bond issue, debt service costs, debt affordability status, and the projected status of the County's general fund balance as of June 30, 1999. The preliminary estimate of the undesignated fund balance is \$11.6M, \$5.4M of which is being held for the normal reserve, with another \$250,000 being held in accordance with the Commissioners' policy; and other \$400,000 for potential debt service costs, leaving \$5.5M available.

Staff reviewed with the Commissioners capital projects included in the 1999 bond issue and Mr. Welkos advised that the \$3M for the Tudor Hall project would be removed from the issue in that the Town no longer needed those funds.

During discussion Commissioner Mattingly noted that while the \$3M would not be included in the bond request, that there may be a time in the future that the Town may need some funding from the County for this project.

After review, the Commissioners directed Mr. Welkos to prepare a list of projects that will be included in the bond issue. Mr. Ketterman pointed out that the exact amount nor specific projects were needed by the bond rating agencies, but would like an estimate and types of projects to be included in the issue.
