Meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m.

The pink sheet is the FY03 capital projects including funding sources. Actual approved budgets from 02 and/or 03 are also attached. On spreadsheet, categories are indicated: 1 is necessary completion of a project; 2 code/APF compliance; 3 commitment/critical maintenance; 4 preventive maintenance; 5 leverage resources; 6 programmatic; 7 other; 8 additional justification warranted. (Projects can be pulled that are not 1, 2, 3, or 4.)

Commissioner McKay passed out a proposed budget.

Budget:

\$4,825,419 (outstanding – see pink sheet)

Revised Plan:

\$1,541,017 (paid from impact fees, tsf funds, or pay go)

'03 Savings:

\$3,284,402 -move forward to 04; combine with 04 budget

of \$24.7M = \$30M

CIP group to reduce \$30M to \$15M for FY04

New Proposed 04 budget is \$15,000,000; of which \$9,000,000 goes to BofEd. Keeps bond indebtedness same through FY04. It gives the County time to reevaluate all projects. Over the past several years, the County has spent heavily. Let's slow down and analyze what the State is going to do. In late 04, look at projects that need expediting.

Commissioner Jarboe moved, seconded by Commissioner Dement, to accept the above budget proposal excluding Wicomico Club House. Motion carried.

Commissioner McKay stated that transportation and education were the most important capital spending items. After BRAC, the defense industry may make cut backs. Making this a "breather year" relieves pressure on the operating budget and moves expenditures to out years. Commissioner Jarboe offered that the possibility of war is cause for concern.

The '04 will go back to the CIP group to trim total down to \$15,000,000.

Commissioner Dement moved, seconded by Commissioner Jarboe, to adjourn the meeting at 4:00 p.m.
