Also that they desired to withdraw from and void any participation in W.P.A. project #SM184X1-82 for the completion of the Chaptico-Mechanicsville road; and to request the S.R.C. to complete this road with the regular road force at an estimated cost of \$1500.00; and to request the S.R.C. to accept, for maintenance, as a part of the County road system , the following roads: Camp Denges road, about .9 mile 7th Dist. Cost about \$100.00. Three Notch Point road, about .4 mile. 8th Dist Cost about \$400.00. Kingston Creek road, about 1 mile. 8th Dist. Cost about \$150.00.
