Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Mr. Stephen M. Jones, et al, presented a petition to the Board supporting the request of the Board of Education that provision be made in the Levy for a new school building in Leonardtown. The Board of Education and the Superintendent also appeared to urge this project and submitted the following estimates for repairs to the present building:

Mr. Joe Raley, for constructing addition for toilets and repairing the roof \$1800.00; Mr. Burch Gibson, Constructing addition for toilets and repair-roof \$2100.00; Mr. Meverel M. Dean, Constructing new room and remodelling one old class room for toilets and general repairs to building \$3680.00;

The Richardson Co. for plumbing \$445.00: Mr Dean also submitted an estimate for a new Brick, four room, school building 48 x 84 ft. complete with necessary plumbing \$14900.00. The Board of Education also discussed the question of proposed increase in the salaries of colored School Teachers. No action taken on either proposition.

Dr. F. F. Greenwell, Deputy Medical Examiner, (Coroner) presented his bill and explained same. Dr. Greenwell was under the impression that all practicing Physicians should have authority to issue death certificates in all cases of sudden death, where the Doctor was reasonably certain that death was due to natural causes.

The Board discussed the question of the County providing a suitable Float for participation in the Gov. Ritchie Highway dedication to be held next month. No action Taken.

Board inspected the Alms House and premises, but made no decision in regard to the proposed improvements at this institution.

Messrs Howard Britton, William Fenwick and Roland Duke appeared before the Board and requested that the Leonardtown Fire Dept be allowed the same appropriation this year that had been allowed them last year. The Board approved this request, and ordered that the Sum of \$1100.00 for the Leonardtown Vol. Fire Dept., and \$400.00 for the Mechanicsville Vol. Fire Dept. be included in the 1940 Levy. This delegation also requested the Board to ask the State Forestry Dept. to provide more Forrest Wardens for St. Mary's County. The Board agreed to do this.

Mr. S. B. Hayden and the Rev. Mr. Gray requested the Board to relocate and improve the road leading to the Episcopal Church in Chaptico. The Board was under the impression that this matter could be taken care of under the regular county maintenance, as soon as the question of right-of-way had been taken care of by the interested parties.

Mrs. Maria K. Palmer, Windsor Palmer, Robt. Gass, Benj. Brown, Louis Mattingly, Norman Gass, Cullins Gass and Will Gass requested the Board accept into the County road system, and improve, the road from the State road to Palmer's P.O., about .25 mile, 7th Dist. The Board agreed to do this when the interested parties had provided a right-of-way deed, without cost to the County. Mr. Thompson asked to report.

Wm. D. Abell and Lloyd Gatton asked for the maintenance of the road from # 5 State Highway at Moll Dyer run in back of Newton Farrell's Place, about .75 mile, 3rd Dist. Mr. Thompson asked to report.

Messrs Clarence Latham, Chas. Bowles, A. K. Love, J. G. Thompson, Henry Guy, Aloysius Bowles and Byron Guy asked for the improvement of the road from Pin Cushon road to Loveville, about 1.2 miles, 3rd Dist. Mr. Thompson asked to report. Mr. Thompson also asked to make, as soon as it may be possible to do so, temporary repairs to the road from # 5 Highway to the Catholic Rectory, Great Mills, about 100 yds, 2nd Dist., and also to the St. Aloysius Grave Yd. road, 3rd Dist.

The Board granted the ST. Mary's County Welfare Board \$8.00 for emergency G.P.A.
