Present

Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved. The Clerk wasinstructed to request the Federal Light House Service to KK replace the buoy on Higgins Point at the mouth of Breton Bay. This buoy having been carried away by ice during the past winter. After hearing a report from Dr Eugene C. Peck, Health Officer, the Board, acting under its authority as the Board of Health of St. Mary's County, ordered Dr. Peck to serve notice on John F. String. that he must abate, within 15 days, a nursance existing on his place "Part of Nun's Oak", said nuisance consisting of the discharge of sewerage into Breton Bay and being dangerous

to health, and to provide subsoil disposal of his sewage. Mr. Stphen M. Jones, representing St. Mary's Hospital, filed a letter from the Md. State Planning Commission recommending the establishment of a Labratory at the Hospital. Pending further information, the Board took no action. The Board decided that it would provide a sum, not in excess of \$2000.00,

for the repair and improvment (including plumbing) of the Leonardtown Public School.

At 2.00P.M. the Board openedand publicly read all bids that had been received for the construction of a wharf at Millstone Landing on the Patuxent River. The bids, as numbered by the bidders, were as follows: P.A. Gatton # 1 \$1600.00; # 2 \$1800.00; # 3 \$2600.00. Stephen T. Foxwell #1 \$2660.00; # \$2400.00; # 3 \$2300.00. Brundage & Crandell Co. # 1 \$4190.00; # 2 \$3500.00; # 3 \$3175.00. Contract awarded to P.A. Gatton at his # 1 bid of \$1600.00 for a wharf 246'x 12! with a landing on outter end 24' x 24', to be constructed with Spruce Pine Piling 10" to 12" at the Butt end, with white oak Fender and tie piles; all sills, Stringers and Decking of White oak. Cap Sills to be 8" x 10", Stringers 6" x 8" and Decking 2" x 8" or random width. Sills to be bolted to Piles with 1" iron and Stringers mto be bolted to sills with 3" iron. Deck to be laid with 40 penny wire nails, with hand rail complete. Four piles to a bent and bents to be 8' apart. Wharf to be built on the Public Landing at Millstone, in the 8th Election District of St. Mary's County, as shown on the plat now on file in this office, and to be completed to the satisfaction of this Board on or before Sept, 1, 1940. Contract for the above wharf was signed this date by the President of the Board and Philip A. Gatton. Payment for Wharf to be as follows: \$100.00 on signing of contract, \$1100.00 in installments as work progresses and \$400.00 when wherf is completed and accepted by the Board.

Col.W.G. Fay appeared before the Board and requested that it take action to have the State Roads Commission abndon the completetion of the Beauvue-Valley Lee State road, and build a section of State Road to connect the #5 Highway with the Valley Lee end of the above road instead, and to connect up the 2 ends of the Valley Lee-Beauvue road with a County road 20' wide. In view of the fact that the Valley Lee- Beauvue road had been planned a good many years ago and has already been built except for this short section and also of the fact that there are many other people who are interested in having this road completed the Board felt that it would not be in the public interest to take such action.

Mr. Geo.L.Bollman requested the Board to build a road from the Valley Lee-St. George Island State Road to Piney Point Shores . Mr. Thompson asked to rep ort and to contact Mr. Bollman. Mr. Geo. C. Roach and Mrs Cora Clarke asked the Board to accept into the County road system, for maintenance, road from the Three Notch State road at Radge to mrs Clarke's Farm. Mr. Thompson asked to report and to contact Mr.Roach. Mrs.Mary E. McFarland axkedxaxpresented a petetion for a continuation of the St. Georges Park road to a number of houses that are not now served by this road. 2nd Dist. Mr. Thompson asked to report and to contact Mrs McFarland. Board authorized Mr. Thompson to apply Calcium Carbide to the St. Clements Shore road about .75 mile . 3rd Dist. The Board signed a deed for the Holmes lots (Tax sale) 8th Dist. to Frank N. Holmes .
