The Board ordered that voucher # 1 1941 scrip issued to St.Mary's HMM Hospital in the amount of \$837.00 and voucher # 218 1941 scrip issued to WMXY: Wise, Treas. ink the amount of \$1538.50, both of which had been emitted from the 1941 levy, be paid from the balance remaining in the 1941 contingent fund.

The Board decided to provide for a laboratory at St.Mary's Hospital to the extent of: Not exceeding \$550.00 for Equipment, and a reasonable amount for supplies each year, and up to \$450.00 per year as part of the salary of a technician.

The Board accepted the offer of the U.S? Navy Dept. of \$2200.00 for the Public Landing and wharf at Millstone.

The Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Thompson and ask Th to try to get the question of fence posts for Capt. Will Clarke cleared up as soon as possible.
