Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Mrs Mary E. Thompson asked the Board to refund \$40.00 for licenses (Beer & Traders) which she took out May, 1, 1942 and after one week was zon compelled to discontinue the business. The Board decided it would refund eleven months (\$22.91) On the Beer License but could do nothing in regard to the Traders License. The Clerk was instructed, on the surrender of the Beer License, to issue acheck for \$22.91 on the Liquor and Beer KXK License Fund in favor of Mrs Thompson.

Messrs Wm. E. Fenwick, Wm. Alec. Loker, Edward J. Waring, and John J. Duke, Commissioners of Leonardtown, appeared before the Board andrequested some financial assistance for maintaining to get extra police protection for leonardtown during the unsettled conditions due to the great number of strangers now working on the various federal construction projects, new prevailing in the entire County. The Board felt it would be better to have a conference with Governor O'Conor on the subject, before taking any a action, and see if the the State would not help out with State police. The Commissioners of Leonardtown were invited to have a representive attend a conference to be arranged with the Governor.

Mr. Joseph Weiner, Atty., Capt. Fred McWilliams, WmF. Herbert, Jr. and Wm. Hill requested the Board to take action looking to the condemnation of about 2acres of land for a Public Landing at a place called Woodlanding on the west side of St. Clements Bay in the 7th Election District, which they claim has been used as a Bublic Landing as far back as the oldest local resident can remember, but nothing can be found in the land records to show that the County ever acquired title to the land, and it being claimed that Mr. A. E. Stone has now fenced off the tract of land and is denying the public access to it. The Clerk was instructed to invite Mr. Stone to attend a special meeting of this Board to be held at its office at 10.00 A.M. June, 19, 1942, to discuss the matter and see if some amicable arrangments can be made to solve the problem.

The Board decided that it would provide \$160.00 to the Board of Education for rental of typewriters to establish a class for a business course providing a satisfactory location for the class can be found.

The Board authorized Mr. Bannard Smith, Chief Air Raid Warden, to have an ax extension telephone installed in his office, from the Air Raid Center in the Leonardtown fire house.

Mr.J.A.Coad, through Commissioner Combs, requested the Board to accept into the County road system, for maintenance, about 300 yds of road on the lower end of the Drayden-Cherryfield road, 2nd Dist. Mr. Thompson asked to report on this as soon as possible.

Mr.A.F. King, Director, C.D. and Mr. Barnard Smith, chief Air raid Warden reported to the Board that in at least one instance there had been open defiance of Black out regulations. The Board considered the matter as very serious and adopted the rules and regulation which are attached immediately following these minutes (June, 9, 1942) and fixed the penalty for violations of these rules and regulations at a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or a month. both in the discretion of the Court. 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Minutes, June, 9, 1942 Contid

By wirtue of the authority vested in the Control (2007) misioners of Saint Mary's County, Maryland, the follows ing rules and regulations are hereby made and promulgated:

- 1. An air-raid warning signal shall consist of a series of thort blasts from sirens, whistles or other noise-making derices continuing for approximately two minutes. .allelear signal shall consist of one long blast continuing approximately two minutes.
  - I. In the event of an air-raid warning:
- The drivers of all automobiles and other freewheel vehicles:
- **%1)** Shall immediately pull over to the curb or roadside, tuen off the engines or motors and leave such vehicles standing until the all-clear signal is given; provided that energency vehicles readily identifiable as such, such as fire engines, ambulances, and governmental or publi utility operated trucks, or police cars, physicians' automobiles and other vehicles carrying insignia approved and issued by the Civilian Defense of Saint Mary's County, shall not be required to stop when engaged in emergency operations.
- \$\frac{4}{2}\$) Shall, if the air-raid warning is given between sunset and sunrise, immediately turn off all lights and keep them turned off until the all-clear signal is given; providand the emergency vehicles as hereinbefore defined not be required to turn off their lights if they are dimmed, hooded or masked in a manner approved by the Saint Mary's County Civilian Defense. In the case of an anhounced tast or trial blackout such emergency vehicles may proceed with lights on without being dimmed, hooded or masked.
- (3) Shall not park in front of any fire exit, fire plug, fire engine house, hospital entrance or at a street intersection.
- (4) Shall not block the center of any street, or stop opposite to or so close to a bus or any other vehicle as to impede the free flow of traffic engaged in emergency operations.
- III. Whenever an air-raid warning is given between sunset and sunrise:
- (a) All lights outside or visible from the outside of any building, either through doors, windows, skylights or otherwise, shall be immediately put out and kept out until the all-clear signal is given. Lights inside any building may be kept on or turned on only where through the use of shades, blinds, curtains, blankets, screens, paint, paper, cardboard or otherwise no lighting is visible from the outside. This rule shall apply to all buildings of every kind and description, including, but not limited to, dwellings, residences, apartments, apartment houses, hotels, boarding houses, lodging houses, stores, office buildings, warehouses, manufacturing establishments, industrial plants, railroad stations, schools, churches, hospitals and other institutions. The occupant of any portion of a building shall be responsible for the observance of this rule as to such portion the police he may occupy. If one occupies an busines be shall be responsible for the observance of this rule as to the whole of such building. In louging houses, swarding houses and other hundres to

The owner, the lessee or the person or persons in charge of the operate tion of such sign, billboard, pier or other similar struction ture, as the case may be, shall be responsible for the observance of this rule.
  - (d) All street, traffic and beacon lights and other public lights on and in the streets, lanes, roads, alleys. squares, parks and bridges of Saint Mary's County (except those which are dimmed or hooded in a manner approved by the Saint Mary' sCounty Civilian Defense), shall be immediately put out and kept out until the all-clearsignal is given; such extinguishment to be made in racecordance with plans adopted by the Saint Mary's County Civilian Defense.
  - (e) All other lights, including warning or danger signals, shall be immediately put out and kept out until the all-clear signal is given; provided, however, that warning or danger signals may remain lighted in such manner as may be approved by the Saint Mary's County Civilian Den fense. The owner, the lessee or the person or persons in charge of the operation of such lights, as the case may be, shall be responsible for the observance of this rule." In the case of an announced test or trial blackout, warne. ing and danger signals may remain lighted without being dimmed, hooded or otherwise masked.
  - IV. In order to carry out effectively the provisions of the foregoing rules:
- (a) No occupant of any building or of any portion thereof shall permit such building or such portion thereof as he may occupy to be lighted or illuminated (alther) on the outside, or on the inside in such way that such lighting or illumination is visible from the outside) between sunset and sunrise unless, while so lighted or illuminated, there is stationed in such building or such por, tion thereof, as the case may be, a person or persone capable of and responsible for putting out the lights or making them invisible from the outside in the event an air-raid warning or signal for a blackout is given. rule shall apply to every occupant of any building whateoever, including but not limited to dwellings, residences, apartments, apartment houses, hotels, boarding houses, lodging houses, stores, office buildings, we chouses, manthe case of horsh, office buildings, apartment houses, and ufacturing establishments, industrial plants, railegad stations, sechagis, churches, hospitals and other in tutions.
