Minutes of preceding meeting Read and approved:

Mr. Jas. J. Baldwin, Architect conferred with the Board in regard to new jail, and exhibited tentative drawings of a building he believed would serve the County needs, and invited the Board to go with him to Richmond, Va. on Monday Oct. 19th to confer with Federal Authorities with a view to obtaining a Federal grant of money for building a new jail as a war time need. The Board accepted his invitation.

Mrs. Catherine E. Ford, Matron of the Alms House, appeared before the Board and stated that due to the great increase in the Cost of everything she was no longer able to care for the Alms House inmates for the present allowance of \$15.00 per month and asked that this be increased to \$18.00 per month. The Board agreed to do this, and instructed the Clerk to pay Mrs. Ford the difference from the Com. Gen. Fund until it could be taken care of in the next levy.

Messrs. Wm. F. Owens and Edward Burch appeared before the Board and stated that Mr. Owens 2 children and Mr. Burch's 3 Children were compelled to walk a considerable distance to school because Miss Dent would not let the Public School bus come for them on the ground that the Mackintosh run bridge on the Hillville road was unsafe. The Board agreed to take up the reported condition of the Bridge with Mr. Thompson.

The Board agreed to accept the 1st National Bank of St. Mary's offer that a net valuation, for taxing purposes, of \$10.00 per share be used in computing their assessment for the Financial Corporation shares tax.

The same to be effective for the 1942 tax. The Clerk was instructed to notify the State Tax Commission of this agreement and also to notify the Commission that this Board would not attend the hearing on this case set for Friday, Oct. 16th.

The Board of Education and Miss L. M. Dent, Superintendent of Public Schools, were invited to attend the meeting to discuss the question of whether the Public School bus could bring three Parochial School children from Patuxent Beach to Horsehead as long as there was room for them on the bus. They accepted the invitation and after considerable discussion of the matter the Board of Education agreed that it could be done under the authority given to the County Commissioners by Chapter 28, Acts of 1935. Exercising the authority conferred on it by this act the Board instructed its Attorney to draw up an order on the Board of Education to carry the 3 children as long as the bus has sufficient carrying capacity over the that required for the public school children.

Mr. Carroll W. Butler requested the Board to accept into the County road system the entire Three Notch Point road, for maintenance. The Board decided it could do nothing further in regard to this road until the interested parties could secure a right-of-way deed.
