Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Mr. & Mrs J. Alfred Dillow appeared before the Board and complained that The St. Johns Parochial school bus refused to stop on the road and pick up their children on it's trip to St. Mary's Academy for teachers, but would take them to the Academy if the Children walked a short distance to St. John's Church. They asked the Board to take some action to compell the bus to stop on the road for their children and transport them to St. Mary's Academy. No action taken by the Board.

The Glerk was directed to write the Board of Education of St. Mary's County and direct it to provide transportation for six children attending the Little Flower School, 2nd District. The children being Mary Rose Norris Dolores Bean, John Russell, Charles Russell and Elizabeth Russell. These children residing on or near the route of the Public School bus operated by Mrs Ryon Matthews to the Great Mills Public School. Children to be kram transported from Mr.James Bean's place to Mr.Allen Cecil's place at Great Mills, a distance of 2.9 miles as long as the said bus has excess carrying capacity.

Mr.Leonard C.Spalding asked the Board to sell him from the Alms House farm 3 acres of and extending along the south west side of #5 State Highway from the East boundary of the farm for 140 yards and to be 105 yards deep. The Board decided to Consult Mrs Catherine E. Ford tenant of the farm before taking any action on the matter.

The clerk was directed to reply to Governor Herbert R.O'Conor letter for asking for information as to the Board's attitude on the re-emplyment of those now in or who may go in the armed services after they had returned to private life and for information about our post*war construction plans and inform the Governor that it would be the policy of this Board, in all cases that came under its jurisdiction, to see that all persons serving in the armed forces were re-emplyed in their old jobs on their return to private life; and that at the present time the only construction plans the Board had for the post-war perod was to begin the construction of road as soon as possible.

The Clerk was also instructed to write the State Roads Commission that it had decided to apply the balance in the County road construction fund and the County's share of the Gasoline tax for the fiscal year ending June, 30, 1944 to the maintenance fund, as provided for in Chapter 703 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, 1943 Session.

The Board approved the appointment of Philip P. Clarke as a Forest Warden in the 6th District.
