Board met at10.10 A.M.

Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Mr.Marye, F.W.A. Supervisor for the new jail, asked the Board to give the Federal Government a permanent right-of-way from the the entrance at the property line of Mr.A? F? King's property through the Court House grounds to the new jail. The Board decided that it would first try to secure a right-of-way from the Key Estate also some additional land for the Court House grounds.

Miss L.M.Dent again asked the Board to provide \$1290.00 for the purchas of 12.9 acres of land adjacent to the Great Mills High School for ENKERS enlarging the present school grounds. Miss Dent was asked to find out how much the owner would take for Rixexexexexexex six or seven acres. The Board accepted the offer 66 Leonard C.Spalding of \$200.00 for

three acres of land from the Alms House Farm, extending 140 yards along the south side of # 5 State Highway from the East boundary of the farm and to be 105 yards deep and to give him a deed for the land

and to be 105 yards deep; and to give him a deed for the land.

Dr. Eugene C. Peck, Health Officer, Chas J. Mattingly, County Health Inspetto Mr. Sullivan, State Health Inspector, Mr. Wilkinson and Mr. Hook appeared before the Board and informed It that they had found very unsanitary conditions in a number of places serving food and drink to the public. They requested the Board to act in It's capacity of The St. Mary's County Board of Health and take the necessary steps to make require any place serving food for drink for human consumption to get a permit from the Health Department before such place could operate, and that such permit be revokeable at any time unsanitary conditions are found to exist. The Board postponed a decision on the matter until It's next Meeting.

The Board authorized Mr. Cecil to execute the necessary papers to secure additional fire fighting equipment from the Office of Civilian Defense.

Mrs Lorena F. Burch, St. Mary's County Welfare Board, explained to the Board the new law which requires that all persons asking for Free hospitalizath shall be investigated by the Welfare Board and certified as eligible for free treatment before being admitted to a Hospital, except in emergency cases, which may be investigated after admission. The Board also decided that it would accept these certificates as justification for paying St. Marys Hospital \$1.50 per day for free patients there, in ARRECA

accord with local law covering free patients in this Hospital. The Board authorized Mr. James J. Baldwin, Architect, to write the F.W.A. and suggest to them that as long as the Court House sewer is under the foundation for the new Jail they allow it to be connected to the Jail

sewer when it is installed.

The Board agreed to pay It's Attorneys in the Trailer License case a total of \$800.00 at this time, and in the event that Trailer License law is upheld by the Court of Appeals to pay them an additional \$200.00. Mr.John Klapp and Mr.Harry Klapp complained to the Board that the County road from Jarboesville to #5 State Highway at Trailers Store is practically impassable in places due to work on the Federal Housing project at Jarboesville. Mr.Thompson asked to see what can be done about it.
