Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Dr. Eugene C. Peck, Health Officer, Mr. Chas. J. Mattingly, Sanitary Inspector, and Mr. C. H. Hook, representing the Federal Authorities, again appeared before the Board and recommended that regulations be adopted which would require all places serving food for human consumption to have a permit from the Health Officer.

The ~~Board~~ <sup>County Commissioners</sup> acting as the St. Mary's County Board of Health adopted the following regulations and ordered that they ~~had~~ be ~~made~~ put into effect January, 1, 1944.

#### Health Regulations

On and after January first, nineteen hundred and forty four no person, firm, corporation or partnership shall operate any establishment serving food or drink to the public in St. Mary's County, Maryland, without first obtaining a permit from the County Health Officer.

Such permit can be obtained from the County Health Officer upon application and after inspection by him or his representatives if the establishment shows that it complies with the sanitary laws and regulations of the State of Maryland.

The permit can be revoked ~~xxxxxx~~ by the Health Officer at any time, if the establishment fails to comply with the health laws of the State of Maryland. The Clerk was instructed to have above regula. Pub. in all Co. papers

Commissioner Jarboe reported to the Board that Dr. Sotherton Key, Washington, D.C., representing the owners of the Tudor Hall property, adjoining the Court House grounds, had called on him at his home and definitely and finally refused to grant the County a right-of-way to the new jail through the entrance to Tudor Hall and ~~at~~ the same time refused to sell the County any land for the enlargement of the Court House grounds.

Mr Jarboe also reported that Congressman Lansdale G. Sasser had succeeded in having the Great Mills High School project turned back from the P.B.A., in Washington to the F.W.A. in Richmond, Va. and that the latter Agency reported that they would proceed with the construction of the school at once and that Mr. James J. Baldwin would be retained as Architect to supervise the construction of the building.

Miss L.M. Dent, Superintendent of schools, again asked the Board to provide funds to enable the Board of Education to purchase land adjacent to the Great Mills High School, and also to provide funds for payment of a ~~bonus~~ bonus to the County Teachers. No action taken by the Board.

The Board instructed its Attorney to take the necessary legal action to recover from the Committee for Theodosia Cox the cost of her maintenance at Spring Grove State Hospital. *to recover on 8/11/44*

The Board authorized the Commitment of Lucy Bush, colored, to the Alms House.

Mr. Roy Bell asked the Board to have a ditch on # 5 State Highway adjoining his property opened to prevent the flooding of his land. Mr. Thompson asked to see what can be Done in the matter.

Clerk was instructed to recommend to the State Roads Commission that the following roads be Accepted into the County road system, for maintenance: The Harry Drury road, about 1/2 mile, 7th Dist.; the wider part of the Tall Timber Road, 2nd Dist. and the Fresh Pond Neck road, About 2 1/2 miles, 1st Dist.
