They visited the room now used for storage of Court Records and decided that no further renovation in connection with the enlarging the Law Library would be attempted until satisfactory storage can be had.

The Board requested Mr. Jarboe to contact Mr. Bowers and secure an estimate for the repair of the sewer system and to secure and install adequate plumbing to repalce the obsolete fixtures now out of use.

Mr. Hurry was notified that it is urgent to have the storage building removed before Jan. 20th. Mr. Jarboe will take care of removal of the Bettle Traps.

Mr. Dean was instructed to prune the trees in the Court House yard,
