TRANSPORTATION

Little Flower School- Mrs. Dale Larsen requested extension of the route to unclude children from section on or near Patuxent Beach

St. John's School- Hollywood, Md. Two delegations requested extension of the route; Mr. Leo Latham requests the extension 2 mi from tarred road to transport 4 children. In this connection Mr. Latham stated that Mr. Bradley Hayden informed him that he has fimmum room for 4 children; that Mr. Hayden's route passes Mr. Latham's gate Mrs. John Maddox, Mrs. Durant Norris & Mrs. Fred Norris request extension of the route to pick up 7 children for a distance of about 1 mi. over hard surface road where the bus can easily make a turn.

Our Lady's School and St. Mary's Academy,99 children to Our Lady's and 45 or 50 to S.M.A. Rev. Fr. Burke, S.J., and Mr. Bell conferred with the Commissioners as to the possibility of rearranging the route and schedule of arrival and departure. Mr. Bell suggests the possible necessity of adding another bus. (Fr. Burke has been transferred)

ROADS

Delegation comprising Hon. J.Claude Johnson, Mrs. Brent Davis, Mr. Compton Davis and Mr. Irving Harrison, desire a road opened from Indian Town Farm leading to Euckland. There are 4 families using this road. Mrs. Davis and Mr. Harrison, whose land would be traversed would give the DEED for Right of Way. Distance is approximately 1.01 mi. Commissioners will recommend that the road be incorporated in the Road System and will request that the same be built: Petitioners would like the road made passible temporarily. Mr. Thompson to be contacted on this road. (OK)

Mr. R.C. Wyche performed work on a road at his farm connecting with the Leon-Wash highway and asked compensation in the amount of \$18.00 for work he did.

Mr. Jos. Henderson, representing a group of 6 families on St. Geo.Is. requests that a pipe be installed at the intersection of a private road there it connects with the State Road, it being pointed out to Mr. H. that under the regulations existing a 40 ft. Right of Way in this case would be impractical and hence the road could not be incorporated in the Road Syatem.

Mrs.R.D. Watson, owner of a large orchard near Charlotte Hall reports that she has 1 mi. bad road from the main high ay to her gate at the "old Burch farm" on the road to the Plains. This road has been recomended for care and oil in 1946. 3 families use it.

Mr. John F. Bean requests that St. Geo. Is. Road be put in shape and the bridge repaired. Mr. Thompson who was present gave assurance that he would blade the road, but could not hold out much hope for permanent repairs under the present schedule.

Board adjourned at 4 p.m in order to participate in the exercises at jail, and will meet Tues. Sept; 18 inst., as per custom to complete transactions of business held over from the 11th current meeting.
