Roads

4th Dist Roads

Mr. John Doby requests that the road requested by the Amish settlers be repaired as soon as possible.

5th and 6th Dist. Roads

Mr. John M. Dolby represents that the roads to Horsehead Landing to the Patuxent for part the way is in very bad condition, and that the bridge should be repaired.

Planning and Zoning

No protest having been lodged at the Public hearing held Aug 12, pursuant to Public Notice re Zoning and area along 3 Notch Road, between Carver Heights and Hermanville, from "a residential" to "Commercial" 30 ft. east of "Ann's Place". Said commercial district to be 200 ft. in depth from the 3 Notch Road to the rear line. No protest against same. Declared to be "Commercial."

Sheriff Willard B. Long requested the Commissioners to purchase typewriter in jail for his office. Clerk directed to ascertain price of rebuilt machine, and to report.

The Board, together with Messrs. Hall and Gwynne, State Br. of Health, Balto., Mr. Thompson, resident Road Engineer, Mr. Birscoe and clerk, visited Sand Gates and conferred with Mr. Hines concerning a public landing at that point. The matter to be discussed at a later meeting.
