Planning and Zoning
No protest having been lodged at the Public hearing held Aug
12, pursuant to Public Notice re Zoning and area along 3 Notch
Road, between Carver Heights and Hermanville, from "a residential"
to "Commercial" 30 ft. east of "Ann's Place". Said commercial
