

March 8, 1949

The Board met on Tuesday March 8, 1949 with all members present.

The first matter to receive attention was the routine auditing of accounts.

Ship Service, NATS requested copy of commitment papers in re Norman Porter, same were sent.

Letter from Mrs. Davidson, requesting Board levy for library upkeep.  
" to Mrs. Davidson advising Board does not feel it can make necessary appropriation at this time.

Request of J. Frank Abell to transfer tags belonging to licensed machines - not now in use- to other machines he desires use. Permission granted.

Letter received from Lieut. Nobel, jg NATS, requesting Board change zoned area in which he has property from "A" residential single unit homes to "B" residential duplex units. Letter turned over to Mr. Thompson, chairman Planning Comm for attention. Public Hearing will be held on matter.

In the matter of Mr. Frank Ellis, bus driver for Fr. McBride- it appears that in Sept extension to Mr. Ellis' route was granted- amounting to \$30.64 per mo. In Dec family moved from his route (4 mi \$14.40 per mo) and Mrs. Ellis reported same in Feb asking that Dec and Jan extensions in the sum of \$14.40 each (\$28.80) be deducted from his Feb check. Same was done. In March Mr. Ellis advised that at the suggestion of Fr. McBride he continued this 4 mi extension in Dec and Jan, hoping that another family would move in and children would use his bus. However this was not done and Mr. Ellis would like reimbursement for Dec \$14.40 because he made the trip just the same. Board feels that he should have consulted them in the matter of continuing the route, and therefore he cannot be paid.

Board advocates the purchase of Great Mills High School at \$35,390.00

Letter and map received from Planning Comm regarding schools.

Mr Bailey feels Friendship School should be opened and used

Dr F F Greenwell appeared relative to his salary as physician to Alms House and Jail advised he only received \$75 for 1948, Commissioners agreed to pay him \$75 for second half of 1948 to Sept 1, and \$50 for the 4 months to Dec 31, 1948, making a total of \$125, and having his salary based on the yearly plan, beginning Jan 1 at \$150 per annum check made for \$125 and sent him

Alms House Mr Briscoe visited property, discussion as to location of bath and toilet rooms followed. Using plans drawn by Mr Hobler Health Sanitarian, Mr Duke and Mr Frank Bailey were designated to visit property, consider the possibility of locating one toilet on the 2nd floor, at extreme south west room, and locate one for use of Keeper and family over porch, facing south rear. Mr Duke to make an estimate on remodeling and installation etc and bring same in at next meeting, Mar 22, at 11 a.m.

Letter from Sen Bailey requesting Board furnish him with schedule of their activities in re school program. This was done copy of letter filed under "Schools"

Afternoon session was taken by conference with Town Commissioners who desire to have proceeds of fees for slot machines licensed and operated in Leonardtown turned over in their entirety to the Town Commissioners. Mr. Briscoe dictated the following

< "In accordance with a request made by the Commissioners of Leonardtown, Md, we hereby recommend an amendment to the present law pertaining to licensing and taxation of coin operated machines in St. Mary's County, providing that all license fees collected on account of such machines located within the corporate limits of the Town of Leonardtown be turned over to the Commissioners of Leonardtown, Md (chap 32 Acts 1947 page 93)
