

June 28, 1949

Board met at 10 a.m. today, all members present.

Letter recd. from So. Md. Oil Co., LaPlata, requesting they be awarded some of the oil fuel service contract for County buildings. Letter to them advised they were authorized to furnish necessary fuel oil for 1949-50 for jail, Welfare Bldg and Court Hs.

Letter to Mr. Paul Nystrom, State Ext. Ser. College Park, Md., advising Bd. allocated ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS for use of Colored Extension Service in St. Mary's requesting he inform the Bd. what steps were necessary to start the work in this County.

Board voted to revise Master Plan of streets in area south of Gr. Mills Rd. in Lexington Park, to eliminate the 25 ft set-back line on both sides of Midway Drive in the area zoned "commercial."

On death of Mrs. Catherine Ford, matron of the Alms House, her son Nace Ford was appointed manager of the institution at a sum of TWENTY DOLLARS per month per inmate (former price allowed was \$16 each) Mr. Briscoe will prepare the contract to be signed at the next Bd. meeting. *Law allows 18 only -*

W.A.Loker, atty., appeared with Mr. Stuart of the L.P. Stuart Co of Wash.D.C., with plans for installation of pipe, line, storage etc at Piney Point, and they were advised this is a matter for the Army Engineers. (Pub. Notice 800.6 Steuart Bros in file) 7/11

James Mattingly asks for Bus Route Contract to carry 45 children to St. Mary's Academy and Our Lady's School. He was instructed to secure names and addresses of parents and children and exact mileage to be travelled and bring all information to meeting July 12th.

Roman Bishop and Mrs. Farr of 3rd Dist appeared relative to increased taxes. Matter referred to Mr. Lawrence.

Soil Conservation plans to tour five So. Md. Counties and explain Creosion, etc., July 19-25 asked Bd. to contribute to help defray expenses, as other counties are doing. Bd. agreed to pay \$200 and check was made to order of Jos.M.Mattingly, Chrmn and delvd. to Mr. J.J.Johnson's office.

J.Maguire Mattingly, Jr., was apointed to Ext. Service vice Sam Burch resigned. Mr. Johnson presented Mr. Mattingly to the Bd.

Roads.

All Faith-Trent Hall Rd. serves 6 farms, too narrow to bring farm machinery thru- property owners request Bd. assume maintenance of road, widen and repair same. Mr. Briscoe instructed them as to procedure to follow and when Deed for Right of Way is presented to E they will take over. Mr. Frank Bailey has viewed this road and advised Bd. should accept same. 1/2 mi. will also benefit others not farming.

Mr. Phillips, opposite Roman Bishop's farm, advises road drains on his field and ruins crops. Asks Bd. have this matter attended to, and same will be done. Mr. Thompson was present and heard both these petitions.

Depridation by Dogs.- Again the County paid claims of \$30.00 for depridation by dogs. Mr. Raymond Suite lost 10 young turkeys. Deputy Shrf. was instructed to kill all dogs caught in act of destroying fowl of flocks.

Dog Licenses. Dept. Shrf. Tippens was instructed to enforce the law demanding all dogs be tagged. Where owners refuse to purchase tags they should be brought into Magistrate's Court and tried for this offense. Dog Licenses raised to \$2 per male, \$4 per female. (See minutes of June 14, for detailed prices.) A test case will be made of Mr. Louis Abell who refused to buy a license on the grounds that the County had never paid him for claim for depridation by dogs to his sheep. Records show that claim was paid Aug. 8-44 - Cash Order #1025 \$58.75.

Fan for Treas. office ordered from Wilkinson Radio Co.

Contract for repairing roof of Welfare Bldg awarded to Hollywood Roofing Co in the amount of \$60.00. Only 2 bids were received one above, the other, from Cambridge Md for \$90.00.

J. Parran Connelly requested to accept position -gratis- on Bd. of Electric Supervisors. Asks immediate reply.

Afternoon session- closed hearing on application for Coin Operated Machines at Gateway and Ranch- Abe Weiner, owner of machines who also produced leases to show that altho owners of bars, were not owners of machines. Licensing of machines refused on grounds that application was not signed and sworn to by proprietor of places above; because it appears from evidence submitted that persons or corporations not resident in St. Mary's County would benefit in the proceeds of machines.
