arny Capt. Byrnes read a letter addressed to him from Tidewater Fisheries Comm which stated they had further information on the marine life in the area in question and they were now of the opinion that the project should be opposed. The Board felt that they had based their original decision on information from Tidewater Fisheries Comm to the effect that no dire effects massmins would result from the project. Therefore the Board of County Commissioners did not oppose. They felt that they should have been advised of the reverse decision of the T.F.C. and given the information on which the T.B.C. based their reversed decision; rather than have it come from a citizen. They took no action on the matter.

Ned Pezrson says the oyster bar extends to Posey's Bluff large bar, 100 yds to Piney Pt creek and 250-300 yds below the Creek goes to lower end of island.

Golden Clarke-bar 200 yrds above proposed site for pier goes up to Breton Bay- has had enough experience to know it is a natural bar and very large

L. Robrecht- agrees with testimony of others bar extends couple hundred bars above and below site of proposed pier

Frank Brown (7th Dist) Been oystering up and down river for many years—at times 25-30 boats are working on the bar and there are plenty of oysters there. Has never been in creek doesnt i now is there is an oyster bar in there; says from 700-800 men making their living on the bars

Jos.A. Mattingly atty, says he can see no good that will result from this project oil farm will be detrimental as oil cannot be kept from seeping out of pipeline. Extra burden of oil trucks on roads will be bad for roads.

O. Guyther says—State of Md. spends millions yearly on conservation, money is received from taxes—should be used for the benefit of the public; doesnt seem sensible to take the money for taxes then allow such a project which will destroy the marine life they spend so much money on to save. 98% of the people at the frist meeting were opposed to the project; the Bd should consider the voice of the people

Letter from Tidewater says Mr. Ralph Hammer was sent to the meeting to acquaint himself with facts— he was not authorized to represent or speak for the Commission. Not having made a complete investigation before they recadered their first d cision, they now have ample information at hand which causes them to reverse their decision. Mr. Wallace had previously indicated Commission had no objection tomproject, Mr. Guyther says he will secure a letter from TFC and present same to Bd. if TFC has no objection to the project that ends it.

Afternoon session spent in considering thematter. Atty Briscoe and Mr. Frank Bailey favor opposing project— Capt M.R.Bailey and Com. J.F.Raley took no action.

Mr. Briscoe says TFC is the proper body to determine whether or not the project goes through, not the Bd. of Commissioners.

Delegation from Piney Pt appeared before TFC and were advised Gov Lane opposed the proejct.

Board of County Commissioners have never received notice of decision from Gov Lane or the TFC

No action taken.
