Lights were ordered from Arrow Safety Device Co-Mt. Holly, N.J. at rate of \$23.00 each, County will pay for lights. Bus owners will pay for installation, approximately \$10.00 each. Fenwick Motor Co will install lights as soon as they arrive.

Both loans were renewed for a period of four months, to Feb-28-50 as Board hopes to take care of this amount through State aid in loan program.

Mr. W.O.E.Sterling appeared with Mrs. Lillian M. Dean, asking that "Quatman Road" be incorporated in the County maintenance system Plat and DEED had been prepared, road was accepted.

Resolution passed that all claims for depradation by dogs to poultry or sheep must be presented in person, by the claimant, otherwise they will not be considered.

Delegation appeared relative to repairs on <u>Old St. Andrews Rd.</u> same requested in Sept. Bod agreed to have road gravelled in bad gpots, as road is clay and very dangerous in bad weather. St. Andrews Parish Comm- (Mr. Thos.Bond) said church vestrymen asked road repairs in order that people from Lec. Park may use road to church. Road is short cut to California. Bridge is

wooden and in bad condition. Bd. agrees to have bridge repaired now, put gravel in bad spots and next spring have road surveyed for relocation. Mr. Thompson to be advised by letter of this decision. He was present at meeting in Sept. when Bd. requested gravel and draining.

Mr. N. Barber and secretary of Welfare Bd. appeared requesting \$700.00 additionl to Levy for 19149. Increase granted.

2nd Dist- Tmitt Read, bus ordered to go down road for school child en, now claims pipe in road is too short to allow careful turning. Mr. Thompson to be requested by letter to attend to same at once.
