REGULAR MEETING

November 22, 1949

The Board of Commissioners met today, with all members present.

First matter considered was

Roads

Rev. Horace McKenna, S.J., with delegation Geo. Thompson, Harry Chesley and others requesting improvement in 1 mi of road between Dameron and Beachville. Seven families live on this road and have no way to travel, except by foot, when weather is bad.

2nd request was for improvement on the road at Ridge- 1½ mi impassable in bad weather, except by foot or horse.

Mr. Richley Brown requests that road on which work was started several weeks ago be made passable before bad weather sets in. Road is used by school bus and bus driver was instructed not to use same when road is bad. Road needs to be shaped up, drained and gravelled. Mr. Thompson was present later, and was instructed as to this matter. He will get to work on the remainder of the road within few days. Clerk instructed to write Mr. Thompson of the Board's decision.

Mr. Henry Eppstein, Bldg permit to erect The Dock and Little Dock small bldgs have been erected for use as storage and kitchen purposes. No provision has been made for off-street parking

P.E.Gray, adjacent to Daugherty's ESSO station, proposed Valet shop- proper detailed plan etc not presented

P. E. Gray, plan for theatre approved (Gray represented by Blaine Short) with off street parking regulations dormitories converted into shops and offices, theatre has not been constructed

C. E. Lilliard (for P. E. Gray) plans for restaurant show only parking space for 2 cars- parking space should be provided according to number of seats in restaurant
Vernon Hardin, 3 Notch Rd Potuzent River and Sportsman's Bar insufficient parking space provided.

To each of the above violators a letter has been addressed by the Attorney to the Board of County Commissioners, advising him of the violation and requesting that the law be complied with at once.

Fair Grounds Request for additional ground
It was called to the attention of the Commissioners that to increase the ground for the Fair Ground would remove a field necessary for use at the Alms House. A small field, approximately 14 acres to the left of the road in the Fair Grounds, with a small amount of timber standing has been set aside for use by the Fair Board if they desire same, and will remove timber. This ground will be at no additional cost to the Fair Board.

Board will meet with Mr. A. S. Jump, auditor on December 13th for work on Uniform Accounts.

Amount of property rezoned for M. Gasparovic is to be 1270 ft. as shown on map presented to Planning Commission.

Board will sit in review of new tax assessments on Dec 6th at 10 a.m.

State Roads Commission advises roads recently completed are Phil Clarke's- Blackistone, and Red Hill almost complete.

Commissioners will meet on December 6 and 13th and next regular meeting will be January 3rd 1950.
