Special Meeting- Almshouse Matter

Special Meeting held today to inquire into alleged beating of Miss Edith Hayden by Nace Ford, Supt at Alms House. Meeting called at 10 and Nace Ford requested to be here at that hour.

11- Dr. Greenwell arrived and stated that he had examined Miss Edith Hayden whose arms were bruised in several places, showing prints of large hands. Also chest bruised to such extent and her symptoms such that he deemed an Xray necessary. Xray failed to show broken ribs, but Dr. Greenwell said he recognized symptoms of broken or splintered bones in chest. He taped the chest. Said he knew nothing about the kicks as he examined only arms and chest.

Miss Hayden had been in earlier in the week and talked to Mr. John H.T. Briscoe who advised her not to return to the Alms House until matter was taken up with Board. *Aug 23 -*

12- Nace Ford appeared and acknowledged that he hit Miss Hayden his aunt\*- and further informed that he had kicked her also- the Bd. said nothing to him about the kicking he told that of his own accord- he said Miss Hayden had annoyed him for some time and what would they do in such a case? He said Miss Hayden accused his wife of having a key to her trunk and also accused a man- Wm. Dyer- of shining a flash light in her window at night. None of this- Nace Ford said- is true.

Miss Hayden said she was sure the room she was occupying and which had been Mrs. Ford's room until her death in June 1949- was wanted by Nace and his wife for their married daughter and her family. Nace told Miss Edith to get out and stay out- she has since then been at the home of Robert Meidzinski in Leonardtown.

The attitude of Nace Ford was that he felt he was within his rights when he both kicked and struck his aunt.

In the spring it was alleged that he had beaten a colored inmate- Janie Barnes- but when questioned Janie said no he didnt hit her- Miss Hayden said he did, that Janie and the other inmates are afraid of him when he is mad.

Mr. Briscoe was instructed by the Board to have a warrant issued charging Assault and Battery and have Nace appear in the Trial Magistrate's Court at once.

Board adjourned at 1 p.m.

August 29, 1950

Altho the Board met for Special Hearing several other matters were taken up at this time.

Bus extension for Redman Bean to St. Geo. Island  
5 small children- extension goes to Mrs. Harry Robrecht's  
if road is good for bus to turn- goes to Little Flower  
School.

Bd. of Education- Miss Dent asked the Bd. to sign for partial  
payment of amount requested.

Mrs. Marion Gibson- Morris Pt. Road needs culvert, ditch needs  
cleaning from Morris' Pt. to Jackson's place road is impassible.  
Capt Matt will look at this and advise Mr. Thompson

Mrs. Richd Downs- reports Mr. Vannalldingham says he will agree  
to road on his farm if he can see Mr. Thompson and find out  
just what is needed. All Bd. advises is straightening out  
turn. M.T.C. says he will see Mr. Vallandingham and get the  
matter straight.

W.A.Loker appeared regarding a R of W over property near the  
Sotterly estate. Road is already built and in good condition.  
Capps and Dean of Hlywd. builders and owners of a large number  
of very good houses ranging in value from \$8,000 to \$16,000  
along this road, ask that road be taken over for 3/5 mi for  
maintenance. Bd. made no comment- waiting to hear from Mr.  
Briscoe about the matter.

Old tree at Y turn on 7 Gables road should be removed. Subject  
of much consideration for past 2 yrs. MCT will see about it.

C.B.Greenwell asked again about road leading to Abell's Wharf  
is used by several families- wharf has restaurant and road is  
too narrow for cars. Mr. Joe Mattingly will give land for  
widening and so will CBG, is necessary. MCT says he will get  
to this road soon. Road matter was considered in early spring  
and promised for 1950.

Mrs. Wm. Patrick-California- has 1 child to go to Little Flower  
Sch- Mr. Hebb will make bus stop here ok.
