

Sept. 13, 1950

Regular Meeting.

Board met in regular session today, all members present.

Dr. Alan D. Houser of the Local Health Dept advised that one of his stenographers-clerks is now a trained xray technician and t us cannot handle both jobs. He requests clerical help, who is also stenog-typist. No decision.

Ralph Balckston- 7 Gables Hotel requested Bd. take over maintenance of road at Hotel. Road needs to be relocated and Bd. with Mr. Thompson will meet at the Hotel and view the situation then consider the roposition. 60 families use the road and over 300 persons live here permanently.

Polly McCormick, Bushwood recommitted to Spring Grove. Was home on parole but conditions made her ill mentally again. Dr. Guyther requested recommitment.

Rezoning of two pieces of property in Lexington Park approved
1- Lang from A residential to Commercial
2-Thomas Ball field, from A residential to Commercial
no protests heard,

Fr. Behr called in reference to bus routes, long hours etc., for children attending Holy Angels. Mr. Bailey, Mr. Ellis and Fr. Behr requested by letter to meet in this office at 11 a.m. Sept. 19 to revamp the route there are so many complaints.

Mr. Palmer has small girl who walks down lonely wood road requests bus bring her to the house- plenty of room and good solid ground for bus to turn. Agreed

The Board will sit in Tax Review of the 2nd and 8th Districts on October 10 and 11.

Miss Mary Dixon complains that pipe put in to deain her farm land is 4 inches too high and half filled with sticks and mud. Mr. Thompson agreed to do what he could to lower the pipe etc to try and please her. Soil Consevation surgested that pipe be lowered for best results to land.

Wm. Pegg road too bad to use cars etc., in winter have to carry in provisions, oil etc. Ask that road be improv d. Mr. Thompson is to meet Mr. Bowman there soon and see thwt can be done to relieve matters this winter. First request for help was made in June.

Dr. Earl Thompson appeared regarding bus transportation for his child and 2 Adams children. Bus is Jack Beans and Mr. Bean was asked by letter to appear here with Bd. and Dr. T tp revamp route. Tues. Sept. 19- 11 a.m.

All members present when Board met today.

Mrs. Gabel, Patuxent Park asked that bus make a circular trip through Park in order that children will not have so far to walk (most of them are 1st graders) 13 children are involved, new route would be Midway, Yorktown, Saratoga and Essex Drive .8 mi and when weather is bad children would be permitted to wait indoors. This adds two more stops to the present route. Commissioners agree if too much time is not required.

Messrs Sam Bailey and Frank Ellis, with Fr. Behr, S.J. appeared to present their new plans for transportation. This will require a third bus to be operated by Mr. Bailey but will cut down the time content. Mr. Sam Bailey's new route will begin Oct 2 and will be 60 mi round trip daily \$227.40 per mo New contract will be prepared.

Mrs. John Madel has been notified by copy of letter to Mr. Alex Hebb that the school bus will not make the third stop requested, between the two stops at the entrances to her driveway. The third stop would prevent her children from walking 1/20 mi.

Mrs. F.E. Thompson, Mrs. Adams and Mr. Jack Bean met to discuss an extension to Mr. Bean's route. It will be 1 mile longer (4 mi r.t.) and if it doesn't add too much time to his schedule Mr. Bean will stop. He will stop on Sept. 27 and notify the Board how much extra time is required.

Flat Iron Road to be proposed for repairs.

Expansion of 8 mi per day added to Leroy Thompson's route for 3 Barber children on the Great Mills Forrest rd above Cecil's store. Extension granted.

Until Board receives opinion of Attorney General Hall Hammond re payment of G.M.H.S. from State Aid School fund, the banks will be requested to extend loans for another year. Resolutions prepared and sent to both banks.

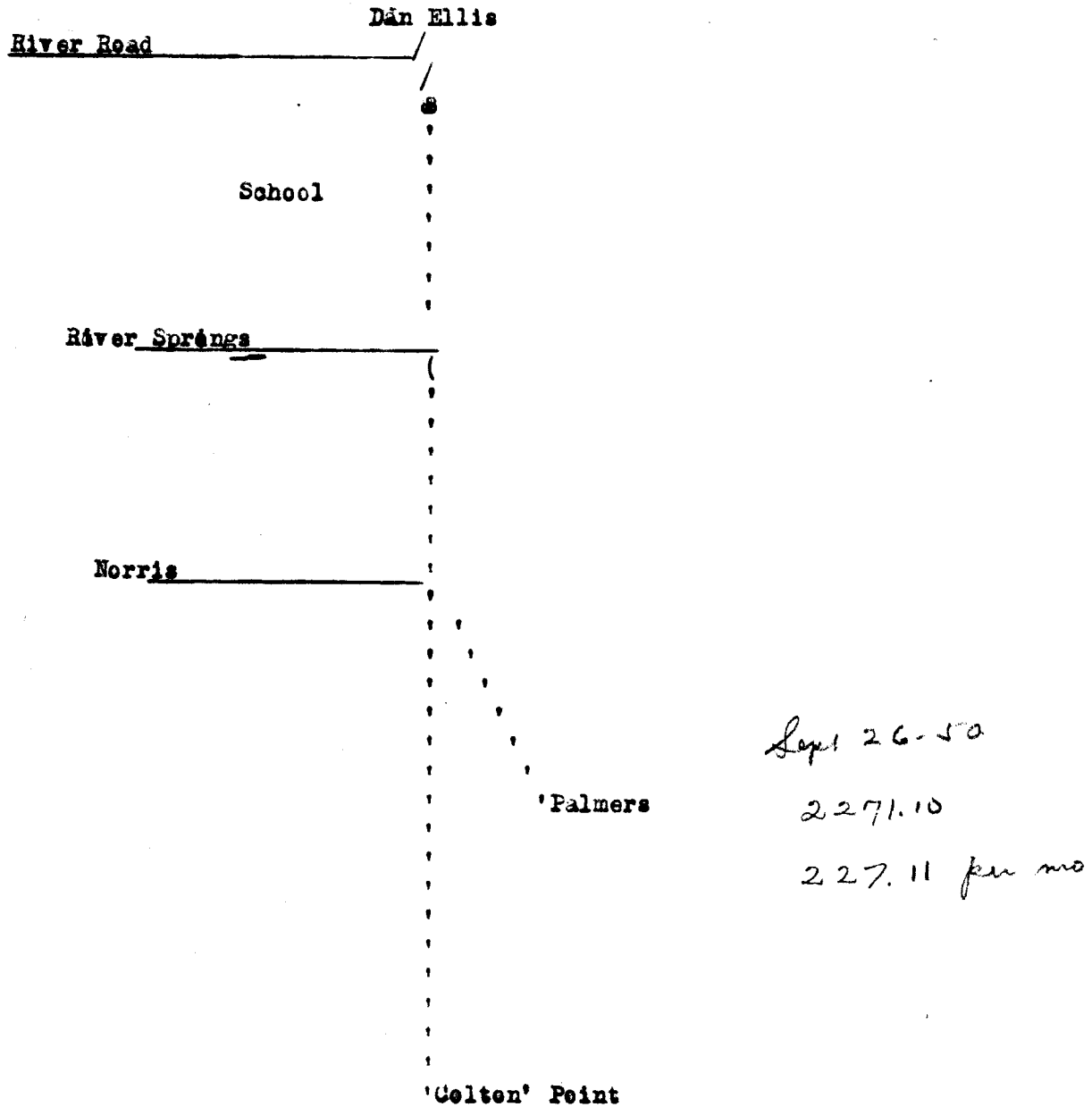
Board agreed to pay for stenog-typist for Health Dept not to exceed \$1800 per year.

School bus contractors approve 12 payments yearly instead of 10 as heretofore, as this leaves two months in the summer when they receive no checks and they prefer checks monthly.

Special Meeting

The Board met today to consider further bus route extensions.

Mrs. John Madel complained that her children walk $\frac{1}{2}$ of $\frac{1}{10}$ of a mile to the bus and she wants the bus to stop in the center of the distance between two entrances to her home. This would make 3 stops within $\frac{1}{10}$ of a mile. Aleck Hebb's bus- Mr. Raley went with Mr. Hebb to see the stop requested and agrees that it is ridiculous that the child cannot board the bus where the others meet it. Mrs. Madel talked about an hour and said she doesn't want her children to meet the groups on either side of her house, but to board the bus alone the other children tear their clothes etc. She further said that bus driver ill treated her child- he is said to have driven the bus right to her door in order that the children need not walk on the road and further asked if they would like him to use a wheelbarrow to bring them to and from the bus. This was "mental cruelty." The Board agreed that Mr. Hebb's driver should continue stopping as before and Bus Stop signs will be obtained and erected at the proper stops along all roads in the County.

Mrs. May Morgan et al- Scotland Beach requested transportation for 12 children- extension of 4 miles per day to Mr. Earl Gatton's route. Mr. Gatton came in and read the letter and said he could handle this together with the Sadowski transportation but could not accommodate another child

Dr. Thompson and Mr. Adams came to meet Mr. Bean as requested but they left at 11:45 and Mr. Bean came in at 12. He was asked to report at 10. Group will meet next Tuesday Sept 26, regular meeting day.

Fr. Behr, Mr. Sam Bailey and Mr. Frank Ellis met to reroute the buses in the 7th. This will require an extra bus in order to cut down the time the children are on the road and will also mean cutting off $\frac{1}{4}$ Mr. Ellis' route and $\frac{1}{3}$ Mr. Bailey's route and putting on a bus to carry the children thus cut out. Mr. Ellis says he cannot afford to operate bus for less than he gets now- Mr. Bailey is agreeable to have his route cut and place a fourth bus on the road in order to satisfy parents and get children to school on time.

James Mattingly and Paul Bell met to reroute their buses. Mr. Paul signed a third contract for \$2520.00 for additional bus to go to Lexington Park, White Neck etc. He will make 70 miles per day and carry 25 children, with room for 25 more if needed.

Letters have been written Bd. of Education, Welfare, County Agent for 1951 Budget in order that the 1951 budget may be ready for public inspection on Nov. 1st. This budget will only be for 6 mo to 6/30/51
