The morning session, with the outgoing Board, Capt. M.R. Bailey, Mr. J. Frank Raley and Mr. Frank Bailey and their attorney J.H.T. Briscoe, were present, and sat in Tax Review

Tax Review

Set for 10 a.m. to hear complaints on assessments of new property. One party appeared. Mr. Walter Flesher of Great Mills asked for a reduction on his Personal Property Tax. Mr. Flesher sold a store, and certain of the fixtures therein were to remain as his property. Later, Mr. C.G. Singleton who had bought the store, returned the store but had removed both his own and the fixtures belonging to Mr. Flesher. The entire property had been assessed in the name of Mr. Flesher, and he is charged with fixtures he does not have. The Board agreed to reduce his assessment \$200.00 and charge him at the rate of \$1,000.00 for 1949, and not charge him for 1950.

Library

Letter was addressed to Mr. Broun, Jr., advising him that the sum of \$7220.00 is in the 1951 Budget for the St. Mary's County Memorial Library.

Tall Timbers Erosion

Commr. Downs of Tall Timbers, ^{prevention} filed a petition with the Board for assistance in the erosion of the waterfront. Pictures etc., on file also. Since this is a very important matter, and requires a good deal of study, the matter was held over to be referred for full consideration by the new Board who will take office in the afternoon.

Mrs. Sam Dyson called about a road near 7 Gables Hotel. Mr. Thompson was present and said the matter would be taken over and road accepted for County maintenance. He had viewed the road.

Health Clinic Site

Board passed a Resolution to purchase a site from A.F. King in Leonardtown on which to have erected the new Health Clinic. The price is to be \$5,000.00. Resolutions were signed and copy sent to Mr. King and to the State Board of Health, Baltimore, Md. Present at this time were Mr. Torbett, Tech. Engr. for the State Bd. of Health, Dr. A.D. Houser, Mr. Tilp, architect and said of the several pieces of land offered the Health Dept for the new Clinic this one was the most desirable, for location to County buildings to parking lot and the fact that no grading would be necessary.

Lots 21-22-23-24 7th Dist

Sold for T.I.C. in 1940 for \$6.91 this property was offered to Barnard I. Smith for \$40.00 which covers all interest to date/ He is to have DEED etc prepared all at his expense.

Mr. F. Tilp, architect

For the new Health Clinic in Leonardtown, Mr. Frederick Tilp of Wash., D.C., was appointed architect. He will prepare sketches to be approved by the Health Committee, and they will then be sent to the State Board of Health in Baltimore for their approval, later sent to the Federal Public Health Service in Wash. D.C., and when approved there, they will be used for the new Health Clinic. Bids for the erection of the building will be advertised later and Mr. Tilp will prepare all papers necessary for the securing of funds to carry on the project, of which the County pays 56% of the entire cost of land and part used by the Health Dept and the State pays 44% of the part used specially for the Health Clinic. All other costs to be borne by the County. It was necessary to get this matter settled prior to Dec. 31, 1950 in order for the County to participate in the appropriation for such building and to retain its #1 priority on the list for such assistance.

The Board adjourned at noon as their term of office was completed.

December 12, 1950
Afternoon Session.

The new Board of County Commissioners, having taken oath of office, were in session this afternoon.

Mr. Leonard S. Alvey, Leonardtown, Md., was selected president

The first official act of the new Board was the approval and signing of expense account and payroll vouchers, since there would be no further meeting until after January 1, 1951.

Tall Timbers Erosion

Sen. Paul J. Bailey, appeared with Cmdr. Downs of Tall Timbers, Md., relative to erosion of the waterfront at Tall Timbers. The Board viewed the photos and petitions which had been presented in the morning session and agreed to take some action after studying the matter closely. Mr. Sterling, attorney, read the law relating to Erosion Relief, tax, etc., and the Board will study the matter carefully to ascertain how much property lies within the area to be considered. Property owners are very anxious for this relief and are willing to pay their proportion of the cost. Prices on both jetties and seawalls will be secured and presented at the next meeting.

** This bank account is used only to pay expenses for the new schools now being erected in the County, and is not used for General expenses.

The clerk requested a receipt for these accounts, but Mr. Cryer took the statements and advised that he preferred to check them at the bank. The telephone was suggested, but he said he preferred to go in person to the bank.

During the absence of Mr. Cryer the President of the Board asked the secretary if she would be willing to give any assistance they might need until the new clerk understood the work and she agreed to do this. Then they asked if she would help any time they asked her to, and she said she would. A telephone call revealed

that Mr. Cryer had had a heart attack on the street and was carried to St. Mary's Hospital. Verification of this proved that Mr. Cryer was dead.

Mrs. Sara M. King was appointed Clerk for a period of two years at the salary of \$2800.00 as set by law.

Mrs. Sara M. King was appointed Custodian of the County Buildings at a salary of \$600.00 per year, as set by a former Board.

Howard Buckler, jailor, was appointed also as janitor of the Court House, jail and County Building, Farm Bureau office, at a salary of \$80.00 per mo, as set by a former Board. (\$960.00 per yr.)

Dr. F.A. Camalier was appointed as Physician to Alms House and Jail, at a salary of \$150.00 per year, vice Dr. Greenwell who had sent in his resignation last year but until today no one had been appointed in his place. Dr. Camalier agreed to the salary until he could ascertain how many visits would be required.

Mr. W.O.E. Sterling was appointed Attorney to the Board at a salary of \$500.00 per annum.

The Board members decided they would prefer to receive their salary twice yearly, \$450.00 each time.

The clerk was requested to have several broken windows replaced in the jail.

The Bd. announced that their next meeting would be on Tuesday January 9, 1951, and adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
