

January 23, 1951

Board of County Commissioners, all members and their attorney, met today.

After minutes of previous meeting were read and approved the Board considered all unfinished business

Xray technician

Dr. Houser had requested that the Board pay xray technician the sum of \$300.00 per annum for work done in the Health Dept. The Am. Red Cross has been paying this sum for the past several years. The Board agreed to pay this, and letter to Dr. Houser was sent informing him of their decision.

Law Library

Wall shelves for the new books ordered by the Library Asso had been requested at the last meeting. Today with Attys. Loker and Sterling the Board inspected the room and detailed explanation of the shelves was made. The metal bookcases will be used in other sections of the Court House and the Bd. agreed to have the wall shelves built as soon as possible.

Bus Route Extensions.

Extension for F. Bailey on Davis-Wood route agreed upon, last meeting. Mr. Bailey phoned in that the families in question had not moved and he did not start the extension but will advise the Bd. as soon as he does.

Ambrose Wood, route extended $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Rhody Thompson's- Bd. decided he should continue additional $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to Wm. Vallandingham's at no additional expense to the County. Letter to Mr. Wood advising him of this was sent. Mr. Wood has been travelling the extension since Jan 9th

Animal Rescue League

Letter to Mrs. Hume Peabody requested by the Bd. to advise that at this time they do not feel they can assist financially in this project as 1951 Budget has been prepared and Emergency Funds do not permit this additional expense.

Letter to Mr. W.S. Donaldson, advising that County Auditor will be appointed at a later date.

B. Spalding, requesting relief from water draining on his property has been advised that this is a matter for the State Roads Commission to handle, and it is at present under consideration by that office.

Letter from State Use Industries re chairs- since price had advanced they sent photos of chairs and prices from which selection was to be made. Chairs selected are \$6.00 each and were ordered.

New Business.

Ebenezer Church Rd- $\frac{1}{2}$ mile- Bd. advised that when Right of Way is received by them they will accept the road for maintenance.

Bd. of Education

Space in basement of jail requested for unused files- granted
ADDITIONAL office room requested, cannot be granted as there is no room. However, Bd of Education may use the room assigned to Supervisors of Election when that Bd is not using the room.

2-Way Radios

Sheriff requested additional 2-way radios for State cars.
Bd will consider this later. Sheriff has a vacancy for a Deputy which he hopes to fill within the next few days.

Error in Shrf's' check

The amount of \$8.75 was deducted from Shrf. Long's expense check to pay for removing 2-way radio from Deputy's car. This expense should be paid by the County and refund should be made to Mr. Long. This will be done on his Feb exp. check.

Erosion Relief at Tall Timbers.

The Bd. having visited the Erosion Relief Project in Annapolis held a hearing with several of the committee from Tall Timbers. It has been decided to have a new survey made by County Surveyor W.M. Bowman, to have a list of all property owners in the area made by Mr. Blair who will also contact them, and after 75% of the owners have agreed to the Erosion Tax they have to pay, the matter will get under way. Comm. Downes presented a certified copy of estimate for bulkhead alone \$24.00 per linear ft. for bulkhead and jetties \$28.00 per linear foot. There are at present signatures of 34 property owners in this section on file in this office requesting the relief. Feb 13th Mr. Thompson and Mr. Nicolett will present a plan for the work.

Sheriff Directory

Request from Shrf. Long for Bd to purchase a directory of sheriffs in the U.S. denied. Shrf. Long to purchase his own directory, as the purchase of the directory carries an Accident Ins. policy with it.

Mr. Geo. Lawrence requested the Bd. to take steps towards getting the Personal Property Schedules in his office prior to Feb. 15- Bd. ordered notice to be inserted in the two County papers to the effect that all such schedules must be in Mr. Lawrence's office on or before Feb 5th, ~~otherwise~~ They would be penalized according to law, if not in before Jan 20 next year.

Civil Defense.

Mr. Thompson, chairman of Civil Defense requested clerical assistance in this work. At present only part time clerk is necessary and Mrs. Mildred Nicolet was appointed at \$50.00 per mo when work increases other arrangements will be made.

Mr. Thompson read a list of his 1951 oiling program. Mr. Guy asked that the road from Hurry-Maddox and Hurry-Chaptico be oiled before some new road received that attention. These roads are bad and are used by the mail and also school buses.

Letter from the Co. Com. of the Western Shore Association was read they urge the Bd. to appear or send representative to Carvel Hall, Annapolis on Jan 25 to consider Senate Bill #28 which has to do with changing the Assessment Law for the State of Md. The Bd. made no arrangements to attend, since they feel sure their representatives at Annapolis will take care of the matter.

Planning Commission has 2 vacancies, one A.F.King-resigned- the other J.T.Daugherty-retired- at present only Mr. Thompson and Mr. Stone are on the commission as Mr. Dickey is in Souther America. Appointments will be made in the near future and clerk notified of those selected in order that letters may be sent to them. The commission members are appointed to

Clerk contacted Mental Hygiene in Baltimore to request patient be sent there, Mental Hygiene advised both Doctors from Johns Hopkins had called and said Mrs. Twilley was not a mental case. Then in Nov when husband Frank Twilley and daughter Mrs. Elizabeth Bunch requested have Mrs. T. sent away she was still refused admission to a state institution. Mrs. Bunch with Mr. Geo. Thomas appeared and made a second request to have her mother placed in an institution. Clerk contacted Mental Hygiene who said Mrs. Twilley was not a mental case and they would not accept her at Spring Grove. Clerk contacted several Nursing homes lowest of which was \$30 per week, but there were no beds available. Bd. felt that \$30 a week was high, but if absolutely necessary Mrs. Twilley should be sent away, in the hope that her health and mentality might be improved. Bd. instructed clerk to contact Welfare in the hope the County would assist in defraying expenses. Welfare advised both Mr and Mrs Twilley were receiving Welfare with Care for Dep. children, \$92.60 per month total and that if Mrs. Twilley were sent to a nursing home Welfare would have to deduct the amount paid from the Welfare check. Miss Lankford was then contacted in the hope that Mrs. Twilley might be sent to Ritchie hospital, but when Welfare asked Dr. Fuchs- who had certified Mrs. Twilley as a mental case - to change his certificate to one asking for nursing care he said that he could not do, as he had just examined her and she was definitely a mental case. Dr. Camalier said he felt if Mrs. T. could receive care she would be ok in a short while, although it did not always result that way. clerk then contacted Mental Hygiene again and advised what Dr. F. said, and finally admission was granted to Mrs. Twilley for Feb 9, 1951 at Spring Grove. The family will take Mrs. Twilley away and sheriff will not be necessary.
