

September 25, 1951

REGULAR MEETING.

Meeting held today with all members and their attorney present.

Auditors- Mr. David Griber and W.S. Donaldson, auditors for the County Books, had a long talk in connection with systems in use.

Treasurer's office- they suggest that a special Financial Account be kept, with Validating Cash Register and new type Receipts and Disbursement journal. Much of the Treasurer's work is duplicated and could thus be avoided. change in system would cost approximately \$1,000.00

Trial Magistrate's office - records improperly kept-should have a system set up with Duplicate receipt system and Cash and Disbursement Journal.

Interest should be paid on some of the money deposited for long periods, which County does not now receive, from any of the banks - but since a large amount of the money lies idle for a long period this should be arranged.

Monthly checking by auditor- if this were authorized the work would be checked each month and any errors could easily be run down, rather than wait a year. Auditors will present a final report when their work is concluded, and request authorization for a fiscal audit.

Mr. Dobry- Budd's Creek Rd, from Bethel Church to Yowaiski's Mill (old Carpenter place) road impassible, cannot get to his tobacco barn. If road were good he could get a tenant. About 500 yards of entrance at either side has been repaired, but other part is bad. Board thinks this is an abandoned road, but will check with Mr. Thompson and report next meeting.

Leonardtwn Public School Mr. J.J. Baldwin called with reference to work he is doing to have town declared a Defense Area. It was so declared during WW 11, when new jail and hospital were built and Board wonders why it lost such a clasification. Mr. Baldwin advised he was going with Rep. Sasscer to attend a meeting on Wed and would try to find out why classification was changed. He was under the impression Miss Dent has proper forms for requesting Federal funds for schools.

Overcrowded buses. Mr. John Bean has overcrowded bus and Mr. Stone will make the trip with him to see if and when any part of the route could be changed, eliminating mileage and also how they could carry the extra children without adding a 4th bus for Mr. Bean. Elias Gant also has overcrowded bus and matter will be taken up at

next meeting.

Dog claims continue to come in and Board is anxious to find some way to curb these payments. Game Warden was to contact Mrs. Peabody and make report, but failed to come in.

Jafoesville-Willows Road- Mr. Thompson has all papers and plat in connection with this road- papers were just recd. from the Navy.

Jail option- Board desires to take up option and Mr. Sterling will advise them at next meeting.

School bus route to St. Joseph's from Hollywood- contract must be signed with bus driver or contractor and not Fr. Johnson, as this is separate from church work.

Atty dictated letter to Judge Loker, representing Mr. P.E. Gray in matter of elimination of existing curb and sidewalks at Cox. Pk in front of Gray's property. Copy of recommendations from Planning Commission enclosed in letter- request denied.

Tall Timbers Erosion Project Bonds- letter to Niles, Barton, Yost and Dankmeyer, advising Board desires them to handle the matter and as soon as plats and other papers are received, will contact them. Plats were ordered from Mr. Nicolet on Wed.

Possibility of new public school in Leonardtown was taken up with Miss Dent in the afternoon- she is very anxious to have one here. Says complete data on population of Leonardtown and environments not complete. She will have information on what amount may be anticipated from the Incentive Fund for use in the building, from the money she receives from the State.

Clerk was requested to advise Treasurer he must keep separate record of amounts received from dog tags etc, and separate account kept. This was done.
