Roads.

Proposed school site at Lexington Park- Zantzinger et al are letting the Bd of Education have 11 acres of land for \$1.00 in order to erect a school there-provided the school is built within 2 years from date of deed, otherwise property reverts to former owners. School Board is to refer the matter to the Planning Commission for approval. Commissioners are requested to grade, gravel and black top road 20 ft wide between Shangri-La and Miday Drive. No curbs or gutters required. Site is within one mile of Lexington Park housing area which will eliminate transportation. Sen. Bailey would like decision from Commissioners then he will prepare the Deed Plng Com approved site-Bd. agreed to road.

Mr. J. Frank Bailey called about the road from Morganza to Oraville, which is in bad condition- is used by school buses, cars and trucks. Also Mrs. Boyd's road needs attention badly. Is to be cared for this spring.

Cornfield Harbor.

Request for road there should be made by land owners Drinkley and Gruber. Commissioners will inspect the road and see what needs to be done, so that the road will not lie entirely on one man's land.

Tall Timbers Erosion Relief Project

Mr. Neil MacDonald presented statement for material-labor on the Tall Timbers Erosion Relief Project \$15,000.00 It was anticipated that by this time bonds would have been ready for sale, but owing to unconstitutionality of the law of 1950 concerning such a project, this has not been done. The bill was paid from CGF#1 funds, and check for same was given the treasurer to cover this amount. When bonds are sold this amount will be deducted and placed in the CGF#1 account, since it should come direct from the TT ER project bond sale.

Letter from Mr. H. Warren Buckler, Jr., to Mr. Sterling explained the reasons for not preparing the bonds. Letter was copied and will be given to Sen. Bailey to see what- if anything- can be done at this session to make the law state-wide.

#### Leonardtwn Pub. School status

Miss Dent was interviewed with reference to the status of the new public school in Leonardtown. The Commissioners are anxious to build this with Federal funds, but Miss Dent is very doubtful that Leonardtown is qualified to receive such money. Federal funds are allocated to schools etc in 3 classes- a- where parents are employed and reside on Fed. projects; b where parents are premanently employed on Fed projects and c- where parents are temporarily employed on Fed projects. Leonardtown has no a or b children, and only a few c children live at St. Clements Shores. Miss Dent suggested that a meeting be arranged between the Commissioners and Dr. Coleman of the US Board of Education who could fully explain the matter. When a requisition is made for Fed funds for such a project there must be facts to substantiate the request. At this time papers are being processed for a school at Lexington Park, but this would not jeopardize any chance Leonardtown may have, if it is found to be qualified to receive Federal funds. However, since the Govt has declared Leonardtown to be in the defense area, there may be some regulations for applying for such funds which she does not know and Dr. Coleman would know all about this. When Mr. Alvey asked if any steps had been taken to prepare papers for a school in Leonardtown Miss Dent informed him that there had not.

#### Jail-bungalow roof

Repairs on the roof of the jailor's bungalow were approved-\$270 and proper papers signed and returned to contractor.

Letter from Atty Gen. Hall Hammond set forth status of Mr. Hurry as Tr. Mag. Since he had been absent for more than 15 days, his salary was to be paid to the Act. Tr. Mag- Mr. W.H. Knight who was sub trial magistrate. Mr. Knight will continue to serve as Acting Tr. Mag until such time as a new Tr. Mag is appointed, and at the salary of \$175 per mo.

Clerk was requested to prepare a list of property owned by the County in order that same may be offered for sale.
