Board of Education- Teachers' Salaries

All members of the Bd. of Education and Miss Dent called about increase in public school teachers' salaries. They are asking a \$300 raise for each teacher- this will mean \$42,600 as they anticipate 142 teachers in the fall. The Tax Rate for 1952 is already set at \$1.50 and the Bd. of Cms. will not have a sufficient Cushion Fund to permit this, but they will take the matter under consideration and see what can be done.

McKay's Beach Vol. Fire Dept.

Messrs. P.T.Hannon, J.P.Boston and Ed. Kogel called to inquire when this organization will be entitled to receive assistance from the County. All members have passed the prescribed course and they have the necessary equipment. They were advised they will be eligible when their company is actively engaged in fire protection

Furniture for Orphans' Court room.

Judge A.C.Latham asked that chairs for the Judges and extra lights be placed in their Court room. Mrs. Clarke informed that the State will pay for her desk and asked the Comms. to furnish them with 3 chairs similar to those used by the Comms. also a desk chair and to have an additional light installed at the end of the room where the attorneys work on the records. Comms. instructed their clerk to attend to this.

Pension for 3 Teachers.

Mr. Sterling reported that the pension formerly paid to 3 Public school teachers - and discontinued last month- could be paid by the County, as the State law allows the County to assist teachers retired who are not receiving a total of \$100 per month from the State, if the amount paid by the County did not exceed \$25.00 per mo each. The teachers whose pensions were not paid in March were advised by letter that the April check would include last month, also Letters were written to Misses Alma Wathen, Rosa Milburn and Abraham Butler as above.

Boys' Club of Washington

Letter from Boys Club of Wash. D.C. requests that they be exempt from County Tax, and if this is legal the Comms. desire to comply. Mr. Sterling will report on the matter at an early date.

Wm.Herbert-Oakley, Md. Tax Assessor.

Letter from State Tax Comm. approves the appointment of Wm.F.Herbert of Oakley, Md., as Tax Assessor to succeed W.B.Oakley, resigned. Appointment becomes effective April 16, 1952 at a salary of \$2100 per annum. Letter to Mr. Herbert advised him of this appointment.
