All members and their attorney were present at this meeting.

On presentation of claim for damage done by dogs, Mrs. Mary O Calloway, Calloway, Md., clerk was instructee to ascertain from Mrs Cabloway if she knew whose dogs they were, and if she did the owner should kill them-if he refuses he is to reimburse the County for the amount paid. If she does not know, Game Warden is to be requested to shoot the dogs. Claim was allowed at 60¢ ea for 81 chickens \$48.60

Leroy Thompson has 2 parochial school busses; says gas and oil is high and drivers request more pay; asked if Bd. would increase his contract. He was advised there are not sufficient funds to do this now, but the Board will consider the matter before the next budget is prepared.

James Mattingly presented bid to carry children from NATS gates to Little Flower school- 70.8 mi per day 83 children; \$293.11 per mol He was advised if possible Bd. will have Navy carry the children, if that cannot be done they will consider James' bid.

Mrs. Geo. Boyd of Chptico, reminded the Board of their promise to have the road leading to her home oiled, this was to be done in July.

Trial Magistrate's report for May and check recd \$397.55

Breton Beach- citizens (Messrs. Fritz, Chappellear, R. and J. Brubacher, Saunders, White et al) appeared requesting that something be done about the road before winter, as it is almost impassible. The dust in summer is terrible. 1/4 mi long, needs gravel, oiling, Board advised they would bear it in mind for this fall- it is a Dead end road, serves 20 homes, is 12ft wide and overgrown with weeds, -4-5 years ago the SRC did some work there, but should be

widened now to 30 ft. R.E. Wingington did not appear, but said he is willing to give land to widen the road, if necessary

Donaldson-Carpenter Road- Chaptico about 12 yrs ago, Messrs Carpenter, Fowler and Donaldson appeared before the Co. Coms. and requested that the road be taken over. The Bd at that time more or less promised to put the road through-from Tin Top school Mr. J. Claude Johnson was a member of that Bd. When the old road was not kept up farms had to be abandoned. Road to Mr. Donaldson's was kept up-if the Bd would put pipe in the road and drain it it would help. Property owners have agreed to give the necessary gravel if the SRC will grade and put pipe in the road. DEED on record for 30 ft Right of Way. Mr. Thompson was present and said there is no possible chance to do it this year. He feels all members of the Board should see the road before making too definite promises. Board agreed to see the road before next meeting

Willows-Jarboesville Road. papers to be completed by clerk for financial statements on Thursday and given to Mr. Nicolet and Board will apply for Federal aid to build the road and it is understood the Board can do better by making a personal visit to the Fed aid Bd than writing. Needs 8200 linear ft cost approximately \$160,000.00.

Leonardtwn School. Miss Dent appeared to ask the Board if they would change the article which appeared in the Beacon, that the Commissioners expect a 12 class room school etc., top price \$250,000 She feels doubtful that a school that size could be built for that amount. Feels that the Board of Education should spend the money wisely and do things in an economical manner, would be better to use the number of class rooms, but it would not be less than 10 rooms. She talked on the subject at length and left asking for a reply as soon as possible. After a discussion among the Board, Mr. Sterling dictated a letter saying that the Board insisted on a 12 class room school, with all other facilities, and that \$250,000 was the price set for the school.

Teachers increment; The Board had planned a schedule for the increase in teachers pay to amount to \$16,000.00 per yr, but at that time no teachers at a \$2500 salary ~~minimum~~ were included When asked if she could use the allotment to cover whatever grades of teachers would be here in 1952, Miss Dent advised that it would be all right, but she was also advised the allotment would not exceed \$16,000.00 per yr. The starting salary for the increment is \$2500 and no teacher receiving over \$3000.00 is included.

Mr. Stanley Torbet was in about the New Health Bldg. He said it is definitely the County's building, and the only stipulation is that it must be used for the Health Center for 20 years, after that they can do otherwise if they so desire. Mr. Alvey asked who would pay for the heat and Mr. Torbert said he would take it up with Mr. Gaines of the State Board Dept of Health in Baltimore.

After lengthy search there appears to have been no DEED from Capt. M.R. Bailey for a Public Landing in the 7th District. Capt Matt talked about the matter, but never gave a DEED as far as the records show.

Farm Bureau- A.E. Durfee of the Dept. Agriculture; Messrs. J.I. Johnson, Wm. Garner, F.B. Hayden, Pres. Farm Bureau Ralph Stevens, B. Reeves called about the county having a full time Assistant County Agent. They feel it is necessary to teach the young farmers, and the 4H boys how to farm along modern lines. Many old fashioned farmers still operate here and it is felt that if an Asst. County Agent can start the young boys in the modern manner, the County will show more progress. At CBHS where they had an agriculture teacher, those boys are way ahead in their work as the boys at GHS where they had no such teacher. It appears that there is not available a part-time county agent as we have had in the past few years as all the counties realize how important it is to have a full time man on this work. A long discussion followed, and the Board agreed to add the amount of the fulltime agent to the allotment for the Dept. of Agriculture.

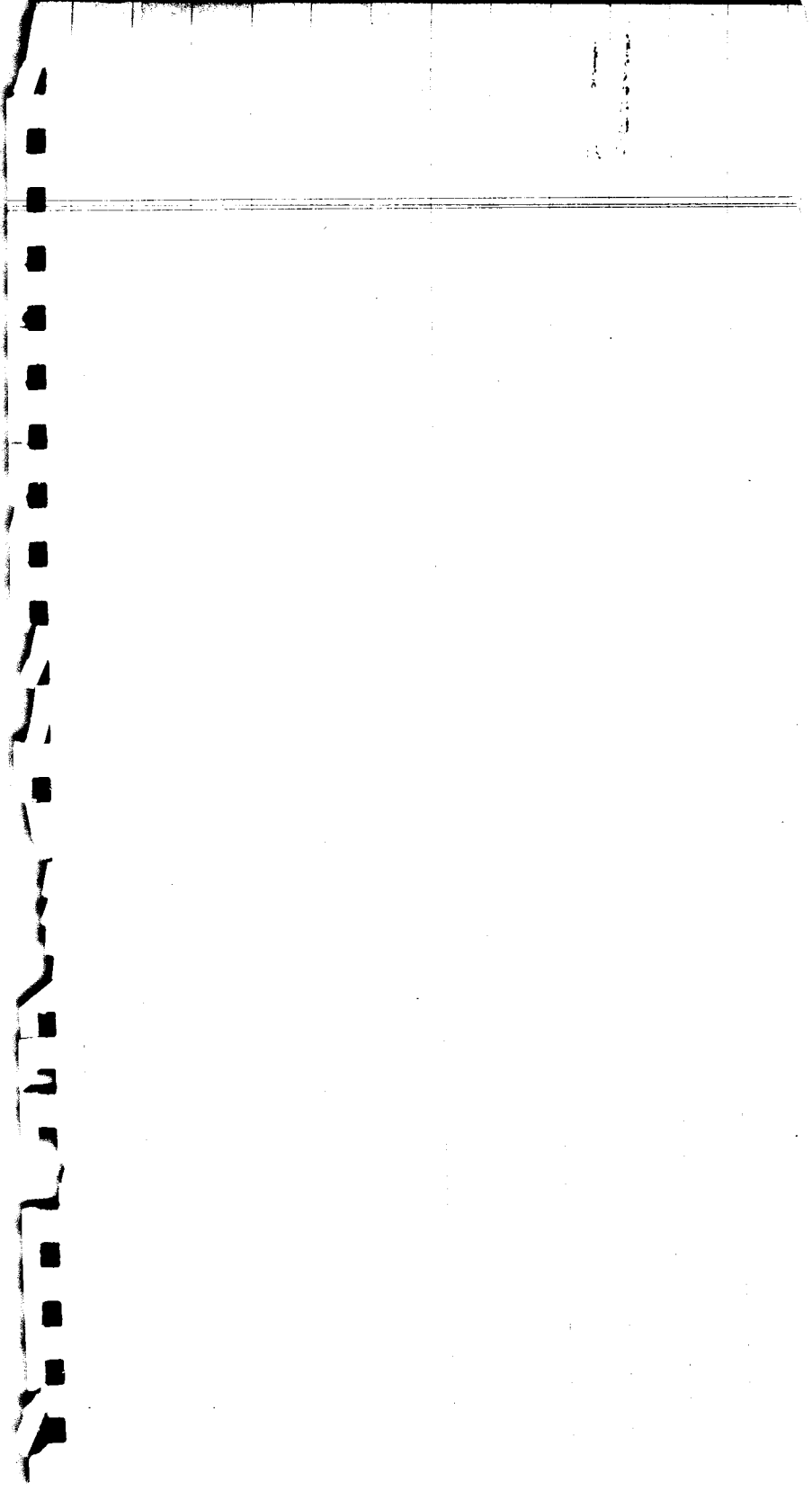
