The Commissioners and their attorney met today in regular session.

July 28, 1953 Executive Session.

The Board of County Commissioners and their attorney met with the Board of Education on Tuesday afternoon., concerning a request by the Board of Education that the County Commissioners make application to borrow the sum of \$406,200.00 for School Construction Purposes under the 1953 State School Bond Issue. The Commissioners desired detailed information as to what projects this amount would cover. They were advised by the Board of Education that they then had under consideration the following:-

Great Mills Elementary School, multi-purpose room

#2 new wing, which would include gym and to abandon the frame building

#3 Jarboesville School -colored- multi-purpose room and 2 class rooms

#4 Hollywood School- 2 new class rooms

#5 Elementary unit for colored children to be constructed in the upper part of the county, 4 classroom school

The Board of Education informed the Commissioners that they would look to Federal funds for the construction of G.M.H.S. and Jarboesville, and possibly Ridge School.

The schools in order of priority, to be improved or constructed out of County funds are as follows:-

#1 Great Mills Elementaryapproximately \$30,000.00 #2 120,000.00 Colored Elementary-new #3 Hollywood 20,000.00

It was then pointed out that maybe some of the momey available under the 1953 State School Bond issue could be used for the new Leonardtown school.

There was a request made by the Board of Education that an entrance be made into the Ridge School. The Commissioners said they would take this under advisement.

The County Commissioners took no action in making the application for the money available under the 1953 State School Bond issue but agreed to take the matter under advisement and render thier decision to the Board of Education at their next regular meeting on August 11th, 1953

There was considerable general discussion between the Board of Education and the County Commissioners relative to the school situation in the County.

Meeting adjourned at 5;45 pm when the Commissioners returned to Miss Dent the application blanks for the loan.
