State School Loan for Lntn and GMES

Miss Dent called for the signatures of the Board members on a request for SS Loan of \$85,000 for the 2 schools above noted. Board did not sign this as they hope not to need to borrow the money. Miss Dent appeared later with the rough plans for the multipurpose room at GMES for which Johannes and Murray estimate a cost of almost \$50,000.00 and the Board of County Commissioners feel that is entirely too high. Miss Dent also agreed with them on that, and said members of her Board had suggested she contact other architects in an effort to secure plans at a reduced cost.

Planning & Zoning

Mr. T.W. Nicolet, secretary of the St. Mary's County Planning & Zoning Commission asked for room in the Court House, or rented space in the Court Square Bldg inasmuch as he is keeping all records and plans etc in his home and he needs the room they occupy. The Board will secure space for him on County owned property. He also asked that the P & Z Com be given authority to enforce the regulations of zoning in zoned areas. The Board does not have time to keep up with all these activities of building etc., and Mr. Nicolet would be right in the neighborhood. In the future all P & Z regulations not being complied with, or a suit instituted, the P & Z Commission would advise the County Commissioner and the matter could be discussed. Board agreed with this.

In order to give the P & Z Com. room, the Recruiting Officer could move into the room vacated by the Bd. of Election, as of March 1st.

Dog Tax-Arthur Hughes of Lex. Pk came in about the dog situation in Lexington Park. people would like to have a Dog Pound the question of paying \$5 for a female dog as explained that the extra \$1 was pt on for fine since tax was not paid until after Aug 1- and was collected then. Collections for 1953 were \$3061 paid out for claims \$1291.75. Board agreed it might be a good idea to have a dog pound since it already had an official tax and

dog collector.

Woodlawn Road.

G. Victor Rodgers, 70 Coral Place, Lex.Pk purchased a lot from JECapps, in Towne Creek sub-div Mr. Capps part- the road in front of his house is only 10 ft wide, Mr. Capps told him it was maintained by the County- this was incorrect- County has advised Mr. Capps they cannot take road over and no one there can secure aid from the FHA for building. Mr. Nicolet was asked to look into this situation .
