Today the Board of County Commissioners met in regular session. Court being held, attorney Sterling was absent.

Tall Timbers.

Dr. Gamble reported a break in the new seawall there. Mr. Thompson was advised of this- he will inspect the wall and report

Road-7th D.

Group of citizens in this area <sup>continuation of Maycroft Road</sup> asked that ~~road leading to~~ <sup>to</sup> ~~Kopel's~~ be widened. Commissioners advised they must have the road surveyed and DEED prepared to give County Right of Way. When DEED has been recored etc., as above, the County will maintain the road until same can be widened. Messrs. Ellis, Bowling & Ward were in.

8th D.

Messrs. Ryseticken, Rue, Gale, Chapman and Lancaster asked that Commissioners allocate a sum for protection against robberies, etc., in the business section of the town. It costs about \$700 per month for watchmen but when they had the watchmen the thefts stopped. After a lengthy discussion the Board agreed to appropriate \$350 if the businessmen put up \$350 a month until legislature can be passed providing for adequate protection in that thickly settled area. The group pointed out that during the time it was known that night watchmen were abroad the thefts which had been recurring often ceased. Now there are no funds to continue this service. The \$350 per month will not be turned over to the Businessmen until it is established that they also are paying out \$350 per month.

Mr. Rue asked if sidewalks could be laid by the County, and the owners of the places where they are laid reimburse the County. Mr. Alvey said he would seek legal advice in this matter but felt it could not be done

St. Geo. Island. Messrs R.L. Wagner and Webster Poe asked that the Island creek be dredged. They brought a petition with 300 signatures asking for this. It appears that the creek would serve as a place for harbor in a storm. The dredging of this creek, along with other work, has been approved by the Rivers & Harbors, but no money appropriated. Clerk was instructed to write Congressman Frank Small, Jr., John Marshal Butler and Gov. McKeldin asking that they request priority for this project. Copy of the letter was sent to Mr. Wagner.

Insurance bids recd. from Waring & Son, Frank Combs and R.B. Broun, Jr. Clerk instructed to write each of them, asking for coverage of funds from Treasurer's office, and in the safe for the month of March 1 to April 1, and June 1 to July 31, annually.

Mr. Alvey and Mr. Thompson to visit Sand Gates road Sunday Mar 27, and see new road staked out. One owner complains road is too close to her tenant house and takes too much of her road. Plugge's fence is to be used as the dividing line between Plugge and R. Dixon's property.

Representatives from St. Mary's Garden Club, Mrs. F. Cuniberti and Mrs. E.D. Chase, with representative from Women's Clubs, Mrs. J.M. Gough asked that Commissioners find a place to locate a public dump in each district. Board considered asking thru the 2 County papers if anyone had gully or piece of land within easy access of road where trash etc could be dumped by the public.

Civil Defense. Mr. Thompson reported contacting several retired service men to act as Directors of Civil Defense, but none were interested. The position carries no salary, but the need for a permanent Director has been stressed by the Grand Jury. American Legion would like Jim Lanham to represent them. No definite action was taken or name suggested.

SRC desires 6 pick-up trucks. Board will take matter up next meeting.

#### Board of Education

Mr. Johnson and Miss Dent came in to ask the Board to borrow \$58,000 from the State School Loan or give them permission to use the amount which is in the Incentive Fund- \$58,000 plus. Board felt it would be unwise to use all the fund for one project and did not feel they could allocate any more to build the new school at GMI- which it is anticipated will cost about \$532,000.00. In order to receive the Full Government grant it is necessary that the Bd of Educa. state where they will obtain the \$58,000 which is that much short of the cost of the building, as far as the Fed. grant is concerned. The Bldg program of 1949 was reviewed and the Bd of Educa feels it has accomplished a great deal in the time and with the money at their command. They have very extensive programs in mind for the near future, especially machinery repairing etc.

Mr. Stone asked that the Board advise Lester Tippens, Dog Deputy to stop the sale of 1953 Dog Tags since the 1954 tags will be ready in June. This was done by letter
