Tuesday Oct 12, 1954 being Columbus Day the Commissiones did not meet. All members and their attorney met in regular session today, Oct. 13.

Dr. Houser and Dr. Locke request an interview on Tues. Oct 19

Parents report overcrowded busses at Lexington Pakr- Mrs. Lester Chambers Qtrs 920 C- NATS as follows

7.20 am trip carries 24 children

Bus capacity is 48. On 2nd trip there are usually at least 16 standing. These busses go to St. Mary's Academy and Fr. Andrew White School, Leonardtown-Paul Bell contractor. Mr. Bell was asked to change this which he agreed to do.

Mr and Mrs Johnston and Mr and Mrs Gladstone called about the R of W on Dr. Bay Jacobs road. Long discussion followed relative to R of W being given Mrs. Gladstone's mother, Mrs. Hayden. Nothing definute. Mrs. G. says 1.20 Acres dedicated for R of W. to Willow Glenn farm.

October 19, 1954

Lex. Pk. Transit Co presented petition for Bus Stop signs to be installed at intersections where their bus stops. Could be used for school stop signs, also Approval granted

Clerk instructed to order signs from State Use Industries 24- R-26 double arrow

Dog situation- Dr. Locke says there is danger of rabies in the County-he addressed several Civic groups and spoke of the necessity of a dog pound. Mrs. Teabody appeared and was advised she could o ahead and make arrangements to secure a site etc., and then appear before the Board with detailed information as to cost of operating same. She intimated she had a custodian in view for this job.

Mr. David Gruber, of Gruber and Co. auditors arrived with the audit and spoke to the Board on several changes in the tax system which he feels are necessary for the work to be done properly.

Dr. Houser asked if letter had been received from Supt of Spring Grove State hospital, it had not.

Dr. Houser talked about the absolute necessity of a Plumbing Inspector and said he felt the Bd should set up a Plumbing Board, composed of 1 member of the County Commissioners, one member of the Health Dept., and the Plumbing inspector. State Dept will pay travel expenses, County to pay salary. So far applicants are Eddie Bacon Joe O'Brian, Mr. Barber, Kenneth Link and Mr. Wiley Hartwell Elbert Greenwell.

Miss Dent asked if her group of custodians could be put on the County

Social Security list, and the Co. Coms pay for them, and she was advised that the Board of Pub. Welfare would tell her whether the money should come from her allotment, or the Co. Coms should pay the 2%. She will contact Pub. Welfare for this information and then inform the Board of their decision.

Clerk instructed to look up ad used sometime ago to call in all script. Treas. advised there is no money on hand to pay this.

October 28, 1954

Disaster Commission meeting held. Present, representatives of the Am. Red Cross, Civ. Defense from the Fed, State and County governments. 3,900 barns damaged 200 down, others damaged but can be repaired. Boats piled up, tool sheds down estimated as follows:- 230 barns \$690,000 Boats 160,000 Piers & blkhds 140,000 450,000 House roof damages Crops and tobacco Live stock & poultry 6,000 230,000 Roads and bridges 30,000

Mrs. E. Rapp, Welfare &lerk M.R. Brooks, State Am ed Cross

Mr. Brooks advised there had been no emergency calls of distress or food, shelter etc. They will help feed and clothe watermen and families until boats are located, repaired and watermen get back For exemaple, if repairs on his boat cost \$800 and to business. a man has but \$500 the ARC will pay the \$300. If all requirements are met, ARC will help replace the boats. Where homes are destroyed ARC grants \$5 to \$5 thousand dollars to replace same.

St. Geo. Isln damaged approximately 6 -8 thousand dollars, including Small farmers who suffer complete boats. SRC will repair bridge loss will be able to put farms back into condition. ARC cannot issue weekly food checks, but will not allow anyone to go hungry or without shelter. ARC will have someone come in and assist with Rehability and to fill out forms etc. The Conference room will be used until after election, then the Bd of Elec. Supvers room will be used. ---
