

March 22, 1955

All members and their attorney were present today.

Miss Pickrel, county librarian and Mr. Fahenstock of the library association, asked for the gift of \$2,500 for equipment for the branch library to be located in the former postoffice quarters in Lex. Pk. All equipment used in the branch library at Frank Knox school belongs to the school and cannot be moved. Details of necessary equipment were stated, and the Board agreed to take the matter under consideration. Upon adjourning they decided not to make the gift.

Mr. Ed Thompson, Hollywood Furniture Co., informed that where the non-resident traders only pay a \$15 annual license, all resident traders have to pay according to their inventory and asked if something could be done about it, since the traders at Charlotte Hall Market seemed to be the principal offenders and were causing all the merchants to lose money. Letters were addressed to the 3 County representatives in the Legislature asking that they give the matter attention.

Letter was addressd to Sen. Mattingly with copy to Del. Raley and Del Combs, advising them of the feeling of the Commissioners concerning the HB introduced by Mr. Raley authorizing the Co.Coms to borrow not to exceed \$200,000 for sidewalks in Lex.Pk area, and to assess benefit charges against the property involved for the payment of these sidewalks; the Comms feel that should be left to the County representatives in the legislature.

Bd of Education with Miss Dent appeared to ask for another State School Loan. The County is eligible for an additional \$221,000.00. The total SSL is \$1,008,000 of which there remains \$84,620. The Bd plans a Bldg Program
