Mrs. Wm. S. Hayden, and later Mrs. Eleanor Peabody, called about the financial situation at St. Mary's Hospital relating to the salary of the resident physician. They requested the Commissioners to assist in this matter. Commissioners feel they are in sympathy with the hospital, but that they have kept their pledge about the Bldg fund, and also paid the resident physician's salary for almost 2 years, as they agreed to do, and therefore they are unable to comply with the request. Mrs. Hayden was so advised.

Miss Dent called to request a meeting between the Commissioners and their attorney and the Bd of Education and their attorney. Meeting was set for June 20 at 8 pm.

Tuesday June 21, Board is to attend the demonstration of Automatic Voting Machines in Baltimore and therefore there will be no regular meeting.

Park Paint and Hardware Co of Lex. Pk authorized by letter to sell dog tags. Tags up to Aug 1 are to be \$2.00 each for male and spayed female and \$4.00 for each female. August 1, all tags advance \$1.00 in cost \$3.00 each for male and spayed female and \$4. for female with fee of \$1.00 for each tag sold going to Park Pt and Hardware Co.

Letter from Atty Gen for State of Md advises that in his opinion the Boys Club of Wash DC, owners of Camp Winslow, Md., should not be taxed for Camp Winslow. Letters advising of this decision were sent to the State Tax Comm.;-Treasurer and Supervisor of Assessments, St. Mary's Co., were instructed to remove this Camp from Tax Books, unless otherwise instructed by the State Tax Comm.

Letters were set to Mrs. Hume Peabody, Dr. R. Locke and Dr. E. Dobry relative to their forming a committee to establish ~~and conduct~~ a Dog Pound on the former Alms House property. They will hold meetings and make plans which when perfected are to be submitted to the Commissioners for approval, then material for the pound will be purchased and pound built etc. All three were contacted by phone, as well as letter, and agreed to do as requested.
