After long discussion it was decided clerk should write to both companies and ask for sealed bids for 29 or 34 machines, bids to be opened Feb 7 at 2 pm in Court House. Atty Paul Bailey-attorney for Elec. Bd- is to check on place for storage of machines, some in schools and also Fire Depts. Also to read law concerning the storage of these machines. Both companies offer practically the same thing as far as instruction of operation etc.

Board adjourned at 4 pm.
