All Board members and their attorney present at today's general session.

L.S. Fulcher presented DEED for R/W for his new subdivision. Mr. Bond is ill and matter will be taken up at next meeting.

Board will not meet next Tuesday as it is March 25,th Maryland Day, State holiday.

Judge Marbury came in to speak to the Commissioners.

Mrs. Geo. Boyd advises her road is in very bad condition, large hole at entrance to her road. Huge bump where pipe is laid needs attention.

Mrs. Ahler, Piney Pt. states road there needs oiling-2 yrs ago County took it over but road has not been oiled. Main road is now under construction will see what can be done.

Frank Barrett-Piney Pt Rd says road is dead end to Navy project. Ditch keeps filling up, water gets stagnant. Will contact Mr. Bond about this.

Bd. of Education came in about Teachers' salary. Asks County to continue \$500 support. Hope to keep St. Mary's County on even keel with Charles & Calvert. Bd. Duca recommends the starting salary be set at \$3,700 and if we keep in line with Charles & Calvert we can keep the present teachers. St. Mary's starting salary is now \$3,400 and Calvert is paying \$3,700. Mr. King hopes the State will level off and the nearby counties hold the line. He anticipates 5 additional teachers will be needed when Town Creek school opens in January 59, as 3 will be needed in that school. We now have 190 teachers

Mr. Cook, new Director of Welfare came in to meet the Commissioners.

Present all day were reporters Flynn of the Star, Hymes, and Mr. Whitbeck. All 3 desired a breakdown on construction costs of the Court House. Figures were given them
