Also present were Joseph A. Mattingly States Attorney, Arthur Rysticken Attorney to Liquor Board, Harry S. Lancaster Trial Magistrate. William O. Sterling was unable to attend.

Mr. John M. Hodges called the meeting to order. The Sheriff requested that the meeting be held. The purpose was to find out how the duties are to be performed in connection with the liquor laws.

According to the Sheriff and his Deputies, there are quite a few bars staying open after hours. The law pertaining to this says-that any licensed premises, divided by a partition or not, must be vacated, that is no patrons, from 1:00 A. M. to 6:00 A. M. on weekdays and 2:00 A. M. to 6:00 A. M. on Sundays. All licensed premises must have one or more plain glass windows on the street or highway so as to enable persons standing on the ground or highway to observe the interior of the premises at all hours during which sales are prohibited. First violation of liquor laws at least a warning is given. Second violation 10 days suspension. Third violation 30 days suspension. Fourth violation Revocation.

The Liquor Board Inspectors said they would assist the Sheriff and his Deputies as much as possible.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 P. M.
