Tri-County Animal Shelter Meeting

Held at Steve Dulin's this meeting was attended, by the County Commissioners their attorney and Admin. Asst. from St. Mary's County; the 3 Commissioners and their attorney from Charles County, and Pres. Wilmer Johnson of Calvert County. They took up the option on the 10 acre tract of land which they have had, this includes the Right of Way for road which leads to the shelter. Fred Tilp was selected as architect and he will prepare a contract which is to be ok'd by the National Humane Society and signed by all the Commissioners of the three Counties connected with this shelter. Mr. C. Steffens, County surveyor for Charles County will prepare the survey. Building and equipment is not to cost over \$50,000.00 This does not include the 3 regular and 1 special emergency trucks which are to be used for the work. The attorneys to the three Boards will prepare an agreement for the operation of the proposed shelter, and decided who will sign checks for all work etc. and then bill the other 2 Counties for their portion

Discuss hiring of Mr. Tilp as architect

Discuss participation in costs associated with option on ground, soil borings, surveying, etc., in connection with the purchase of ground.

It was unanimously decided to engage the services of Mr. Tilp as the Architect for the Tri-County Animal Shelter. Mr. Tilp was requested to execute a contract for the signatures of the three Boards.

It was unanimously decided to purchase the site for the Animal Shelter from Mr. Goldsmith at the price of \$200 per acre and to acquire a total acreage of 10¹ acres with the right of way included. Mr. Steffens, County Surveyor for Charles County, will be asked to survey the site.

It was unanimously decided to appoint Mr. Sullivan as paying agent for bills associated with the purchase of the ground, construction of building, ect., and to bill the other Counties for their proportionate share of these costs.
