

Sept. 13, 1960

All officials present.

Mrs. Meldrum, also representing Mrs. Kraft, both of Half Pone Point Rd-Hollywood requested transportation for 2 girls living $\frac{1}{2}$ mi above the Point to St. Mary's Academy. Mrs. Luke Mattingly formerly had contract for this but will not have it this year. Mrs. Meldrum asked if the Commissioners could secure someone else to make this run to the Hlywd Gen store, and meet the SMA bus. Mrs Huntt will carry them home in the evening-the problem is the morning transportation.

Sen Bailey came to ask if the Commissioners to certain State Roads Commission matters-they agreed.

Sen. Walter Dorsey, Jimmie Finnacom and Ralph Chesser, the latter two own the Friendly Cab Service of Lex. Pk. and they came to protest the granting of a license for the operation of a 2nd Cab Service Co to E.D. Weber, Grove S Hickman and E. Martin. Commissioners instructed Mr. Weber to make application in writing for this license and Notice of Hearing will be advertised in 3 County papers, for Sept. 27, 11 a.m.

Earl Gatton reported an overloaded bus. Commissions agreed to a new contract for \$4,000 per yr for 5 years. Mr. Gatten's other contracts will be extended for 4 additional years in 1961 He will be allowed a payment of \$300 on the new bus he will buy.

Messrs. Smith, McKeever and Nave of the Audit Dept. State Health Dept., came in regarding the sum of \$3,258.00 due on the L.L. Feimster account. Letter was written, at the request of Mr. Nave, stating the Commissioners agreed to pay this amount at the rate of \$500 per quarter, commencing in Oct 1960, continuing to Jan 62, for \$500, and the 7th check to be April 62 \$258.00.

Jr. Raley came in to discuss the damage done by hurricane Donna.

Geo..W. Smith, of the Luke Mattingly Road, complained about condition of the road etc. Jr. Raley will send him a form to fill in agreeing to give a 10 ft. Right of Way.

SRC will erect a Stop Sign at the intersection of the "Abell and 470 Rd." on the Abell side.

Mrs. Guy will carry the Clem Johnson children to SRC 245 in the morning and will carry them from 245 to their home in the evening for \$30.00 per mo.

Board adjourned at 3 pm to attend the Tri-County meeting about the Animal Shelter in Charles County., when bids for the shelter were to be opened.
