All members present today.

Mrs. Wm, Groves, Calif, Md., again requested transportation for her son to Ryken High school. No decision. *See below*

Ray Quade advised his bus overloaded. Jimmy Knight, driver for Alton Bailey instructed to take on 8 pupils in Oraville area who formerly rode Quade's bus. any additional mileage will be added to Bailey's contract.

Paul Bell instructed to go to Rosecroft for 2 Huntington children and to pick up children in Tudor Hall area at Court House Dr near library- total 7 miles additional to be added to Bell's contract.

Chas. Jos. Herbert whose regular run is to Sandy Bottom instructed to pick up the Groves boy at Sandy Bottom and after discharging pupils at Fr. Andrew White school, carry Groves boy to Ryken, in the morning. He will pick up the Groves boy at Ryken in the evening and carry him to Sandy Bottom. Extra mileage involved will be from Fr. Andrew White to Ryken and return to Fr Andrew White in the morning, and same mileage in the evening.

Letter to Dr. J.H.Griffin, Hughesville, Md regarding transportation of 5 boys from Chas.Co. line to Ryken. He was advised Quade's bus which would have carried the boys this year was overloaded and had to re-allocate 8 pupils from the Oraville area to Alton Bailey's bus. Quade's contract terminates June 1961 and if Dr. Griffin will transport the boys for the term ending June 61, something may be worked out to transport them for the term beginning Sept 61.

Mr. Tarbutton, representing International Correspondence school asked if Commissioners would be interested in having Court House employees take course pertaining to their work. Commissioners felt the employees should be contacted individually.

Letter received from Mrs. Helen Murowski, St. Mary's City, re condition of Bauer road. She was advised by letter Commissioners hope to have this road rebuilt in 1961.

SRC-Jr Raley advised wharf at Forrest ^{land}ing had been torn down. ~~AB~~forebids for the rebuilding of wharf were published in all 3 County papers- these sealed bids to be opened Oct 4, at 11 a.m. Commissioners office.

Clarence Clawson, Admin. Officer, Bur. Rd. Design SRC sent in 1 set of plans and 1 set right-of-way plats for SM 300-8-520, Md. R #5 Charles County line to Charlotte Hall- letter of acknowledgement sent him.
