Mrs. Gregson and W.J.Geiger came in about a Kindergarten at Frank Knox school One operating for children residing on base will not operate the coming school year due to lack of space. Space available at Frank Knox school, Navy will furnish desks, equipment etc., at no cost to County; certified teachers are available for this work. Pub. law 874 provides Federal aid for children from the base, and 95% of children in this area come under this law. Kindergarten reduces 1st grade "flunk-outs" by 60-69%. Commissioners are interested in this and will contact Mr. Robt. King, Supt Pub. schools regarding same.
