

June 13, 1961

All officials present today and Commissioners' first act was to award the contract for the Rubber tired front end loader from the W-M-D Equipment Co of Ellicott City, Md., for \$12,209.25 F.O.B. destination. Mr. Thompson and Mr. Cullum of SRC were present at this award. Decision was to wait before awards for other 2 pieces of equipment were made.

Mr. and Mrs. Killian Laschalt, Loveville, Md.; Dr. Houser and Virgil Mast of the Health Dept and Atty Hos. D. Weiner with the Commissioners continued the discussion of June 6th regarding the division of the Laschalt farm. Dr. Houser advised the Laschalt's it was necessary for them to prepare a plat map of the farm, showing the location of the house. Copies of this plat map are to be furnished Health Dept and Planning & Zoning Commission. Mr. Laschalt agreed to do this, and the Commissioners approved issuance of a Building Permit for the house to be erected by Killian Laschalt, Jr.

Dr. Houser and Mr. Mast also discussed the Cuniberti farm sub-division. A meeting which Dr. Houser is to arrange, is to be held between Dr. Houser, Tidewater Fisheries and the Commissioners, at which time the Commissioners will render their decision regarding this sub-division. They also discussed the need for a County Sanitary Commission.

James M. Feniano, representing Burroughs Corp., explained the machine that his company manufactures for work of Tax Bills, etc. Commissioners informed him they had just started using the IBM system and at this time did not care to make a change. Mr. Feniano will contact Mr. Lipski on this subject.

Kenneth B. Duke was reappointed Clerk to the Board of Supervisors of Election and Wm.O.E. Sterling will be their attorney.

Shoup Voting Machine Co wrote the Supervisors of Election advising them of the new attachments needed for the St. Mary's County voting machines. Mr. Duke replied setting a meeting with their representative, himself and the Commissioners on Tues. June 27, at 2:30 pm. If date not satisfactory to Shoup, they are to select any Tuesday except July 4, and advise the Commissioners when they will be here.

A letter was written to Mr. Jack King, chrmn of the Organization and Acquisition Committee, Lex. Park Home Owners, advising him the Commissioners endorsed the action and endeavors of this organization to acquire from the US Govt, Housing units in Lex. Pk. which the govt. contemplates declaring surplus.

SRC Mr. Urquhart of the Alban Tractor Co was advised the front end loader will be purchased from the W-M-D Equipment Co of Ellicott City, Md., but no other equipment will be purchased at this time.

2. Chas. Choate and Robt. Stevens advised of a condition on Old Willows Rd creating a watef problem at Coral Dr. Commissioners informed them they had received a bid on this work from Mr. Stroud and this matter would be taken care of as soon as possible. Drainage problem on Stevens' road will be taken care of to the extent that it will be usable in winter. This is not a permanent solution.

3. Letter to be sent Thos. Harding of L.A. Clarke Co informing him the Commissioners have awarded the contract to them for materials needed for wharves.

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4. Mr. Cullum was asked to complete specifications etc on Tall Timbers Seawall to determine materials required to repair wall in order that ad for bids can be published.

5. Mr. Cullum will have pick up trucks belonging to the County painted YELLOW.

6. Mr. Cullum and Jr. Raley recommended Palmer Lacey as operator of the new loader. Commissioners agreed.

7. Opposite the SRC Garage on road to Compton is property belonging to Moore heirs. SRC and Commissioners desire this property and building on the site, However, the Commissioners feel the property should be purchased by the Md. SRC since SRC is using County property now for their storage etc. Letter to be written to SRC (dictated by WOES) and copy sent to Comms. Paul J. Bailey

8. Mrs. Dick Gibson, resident of Cabbage Alley in the 7th D. reported the road ^{County} from her property to that of Mrs. Connie Lawrence in very bad condition. Commissioners advised her that this road will be gravelled and surface treated.

9. Shrf. Miedzinski was requested by the Commissioners to come in and discuss road to be built -ShangriLa Dr. He was advised 60ft for R/W are necessary for the road to the building being erected for the C & P telephone Co. He was also advised no Bldg permit can be issued to him until his plans are approved by the Planning & Zoning Com. He agreed to have Kogel, as surveyor to meet with the P & Z Com to determine just what was necessary to receive approval for this project.

Charles Martin of Hollywood submitted his application for position with the SRC- this was sent to SRC

Commissioners signed DEED returning to Wm. R. and Emily Chesley, his wife, the tract of land formerly used as the "Adams Road" in the 5th District, the road having been abandoned. Wm.M.Loker has the DEED.
