Meeting July 11, all officials present.

Messrs. Faye Latham, Virgil Mast and T. Brazelton appeared regarding Cuniberti farm, Aviation, Yacht and Country Club. Robt. M. Frown, chief, Bureau of Environmental Hygiene, State Dept. of Health advised Mr. Latham the present plans for the Cuniberti farm would restrict the oyster beds-did not go into detail as to size of beds. Plans for the A.Y.and C. Club would possibly include 50 housing units with sewage going into 2 lagoons and from there into a large lake. This will be part of the landscaping of the golf course. Mr. Brown might approve this. Would require more inland land on the Cuniberti farms. Formal application to be made to the Commissioners for Cuniberti farm and Aviation, Yacht and Country Club plans; Commissioners will then investigate matters and render their decision, in accord with the Health Dept.

Mrs. Barber and R.B.Broun, Jr., representing St. Mary's County Memorial Library Association, asked assistance in the purchase of a new bookmobile. This would cost \$9,000 but the Library has saved \$5,000 towards this and need \$4,000.00 additional. The Bd. of Trustees of the Library will negotiate a loan of \$4,000 at the 1st Nat. Bank, Leonardtown, for 2 years, Commissioners will endorse the Bd. of Trustee's, allowing \$2,000 in the 62-63 Budget and \$2,000 in the 63-64 Budget.

Valley Greenwell advised that Wilmer Russell wants permission to erect house where Brothers' property joins that of Stephen Foxwell, & Commissioners. Latter will check this site and let Mr. Russell know their decision.

SRC Jr. Raley came in and later Mr. Thompson arrived. Plans are

Atty Sterling is to negotiate with Mr. Lancaster for this R/W, Commissioners will purchase the R/W and SRC will build the entrance to Mr. Wood's property.

Donaldson be given \$4,200 pr yr and the 3 Asst operators be given \$3,600 per yr. Commissioners agreed on this. Position of Administration and Supply Officer will remain open for the time being. Ralph Abell, Sr., explained he had been advised by the State Assessment & Taxation, that the Supervisors of Assessments' office should raise those districts which had not been re-assessed by the end of the year 20%, which is approximately what the other districts have been raised as a result of the re-assessment. Commissioners asked Mr. Abell to arrange a meeting between them and Mr. Ward of the State Assessment & Taxation Com.
