All officials present.

Messrs. Fred Tilp and M.C. Thompson, Jr., presented plans and specifications for a proposed Municipal Bldg. The above named gentlemen will meet with the Commissioners again on Tues. June 26, at 3 p.m. accompanied by certain government representatives, to discuss this matter thoroughly. Mr. Duke was authorized to invite J. Frank Raley, Jr; Gen. Hume Peabody; John Hanson Briscoe; F. Elliott Burch; J. Wilmer Bowles; Clarence Ridgell; and Wm. George to be present at this time.

Mr. Duke was requested to notify J. Louis Mattingly to make an investigation of a house being built at Potomac Beach without a Bldg Permit. Mr. Mattingly was also to be requested to appear before the Commissioners on June 26 at 11 a.m. to furnish a report on his work to date.

SRC Jr. Raley made his weekly visit to discuss roads in general and was authorized to continue the work now in progress.

Wm.M.Loker, Jr., Council for the Supervisors of Election asked the Commissioners to request the Supervisors of Elections to appoint a clerk to the Board.

J.Ralph Abell, Sr., Supervisor of Assessments & Taxation asked that Margaret Yowaiski be appointed temporarily to his office, due to the illness of Anne Fowler. Mrs. Fowler was granted leave of absence with pay.

C. Winfield Pickell inspected the slab outside the west side door of the County Office Bldg, where cement is crumbling away. He recommended this work not be done unless cement material could be placed thereon, not over one inch thick. He will check and see if such material is available for outside work. Mr. Pickell was authorized to complete work in the jailor's bungalow, and to do minor repairs in the Court House.

The Commissioners approved vouchers for salary and expenses for June, and adjourned at 3:30 p.m.
