

Sept. 11, 1962

All officials were present when the Commissioners met in regular session today. Minutes of previous meeting were approved as read.

Parking space reserved for officials : Wm. M. Loker, Jr., requested that a parking space be reserved for the use of Judge Dorsey. The Commissioners decided that the small area in rear of the office of the Register of Wills be reserved for use of the Circuit Court Judges and the County Commissioners. Dennis Raley, SRC, will erect a suitable sign to be placed there and Shrf. Miedzinski will police same.

Robert E. King, Jr., Supt. Bd. of Education requested that a large electric panel box be installed in the office of the Supt. of Schools, in order that the present Conference room be used for a Board of Education office, and the office now used by the Bd. of Education be converted into a Conference room. Commissioners agreed upon this.

SRC roads Richley Brown- Brown Rd. Commissioners agreed to have Dennis Raley, Jr., put gravel on this road, and road will be put on 1963 schedule for oiling. Rd. in 3rd Elec. Dist.

Cmdr. Durfee Presbyterian Church, Town Creek, drainage problem at church; Mr. Raley advised that black topping along Town Creek Drive will be done in the latter part of October, at which time a suitable drain will be constructed to handle the matter.

Street Signs-Town Creek : Arthur Rysticken, Pres. Town Creek Citizens' Association to be informed that \$194.25 is the share to be paid by the organization for the signs and posts; that they will be erected by the State Roads Commission at a cost to the County Commissioners of \$104.55.

Sypher Road. 8th Elec. Dist. The Commissioners agreed to accept this road for maintenance after a 40ft R/W has been obtained, land surveyed and dedicated, DEED recorded - all at no cost to the County. Dennis Raley, Jr. SRC will check this road out with Mrs. Sypher.
