NBC Representative- Radio & T.V. came to request information from, and their appearance on TV of the County Commissioners, regarding Coin Operated machines and all other forms of gambling in this County. The Commissioners agreed that the parties to be contacted were former Senators Paul J. Bailey and Walter B. Dorsey on these subjects.

Nursing Home Dr. Houser, SDHO, and Mr. Fred Tilp, architect presented to the Commissioners a letter from the McCrome Engineering Co, in which the latter offered to do the preliminary engineering sketches on the proposed Nursing Home, without charge.

Speed in Lex. Park Mr. E. Wiseman of Lex. Park, requested the reduction of the speed limit in Patuxent Park. He was advised to have a letter addressed to the County Commissioners and signed by a committee of citizens of that area, requesting that this be done. Then the Commissioners will forward the letter to the SRC for attention.

Paro. school busses. Thos Waring requested that the paro school bus route be extended to the outer gate of Society Hill subdivision. This is satisfactory with the Commissioners if the driver (Paul Bell) can work it in to his schedule.

Ryken School. Elmer Hall and Bro. Charles were in regarding pupils of Ryken School. These boys stop at the North End Store-opposite St. Mary's Academy. The Commissioners agreed to try and work out something with Paul Bell to remedy the situation.

Roads. Dennis Raley, Jr., made his weekly report on the progress of road work, which he says is very satisfactory
