



The IBM program for the running and processing of the County's 1963 assessment and tax rolls is being prepared and scheduled.

We are also proceeding with our 1962 -1963 audit work, which as in the past has been on a continuing retainer basis. This is particularly applicable to the quarterly collection analysis of each respective tax levy.

Because of the overlap of this work between the present and future Board, your acknowledgement of our present authorization relative to these two items is respectfully requested.


The basis for the 1963 tax assessment and billing rolls would be as follows:

We will update and correct the necessary master card files, print separate assessment rolls for each of the nine election districts at as early a date as possible, prepare and deliver tax bills and tax rolls and tax collection cards, and preform a separate listing of assessments by class of property under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. We will bill St. Mary's County directly for all paper costs, binders, etc. as incurred by us.
- 2. We will pay all machine costs directly.
- 3. We will charge the County \$230.50 per one thousand cards pulled or replaced in the master deck. This consists of cards from the prior years which are to be corrected or removed and any new cards added this year, either as a replacement of removed cards or as additional or new data.

- 4. We will charge the County \$42.50 per one thousand cards used to list assessments rolls, tax rolls, tax bills and tax collection cards. This also includes all of the computation and calculation of tax bills.
- 5. After the completion of all other work as outlined above, it will be necessary for us to run a separate listing of property by classes, i.e.: Residential, Commercial and Agricultural. We would estimate this listing to cost about \$150.00.

As you may recall the State of Maryland required the inclusion of a considerable amount of detailed information in the 1962 rolls. While this resulted in extra costs for 1962 the data is now a part of the master cards and the 1963 processing costs should be substantially less than 1962 even with the reassessment of the 3rd. and 4th. districts.

The per thousand card rates quoted are the same as in 1962.
